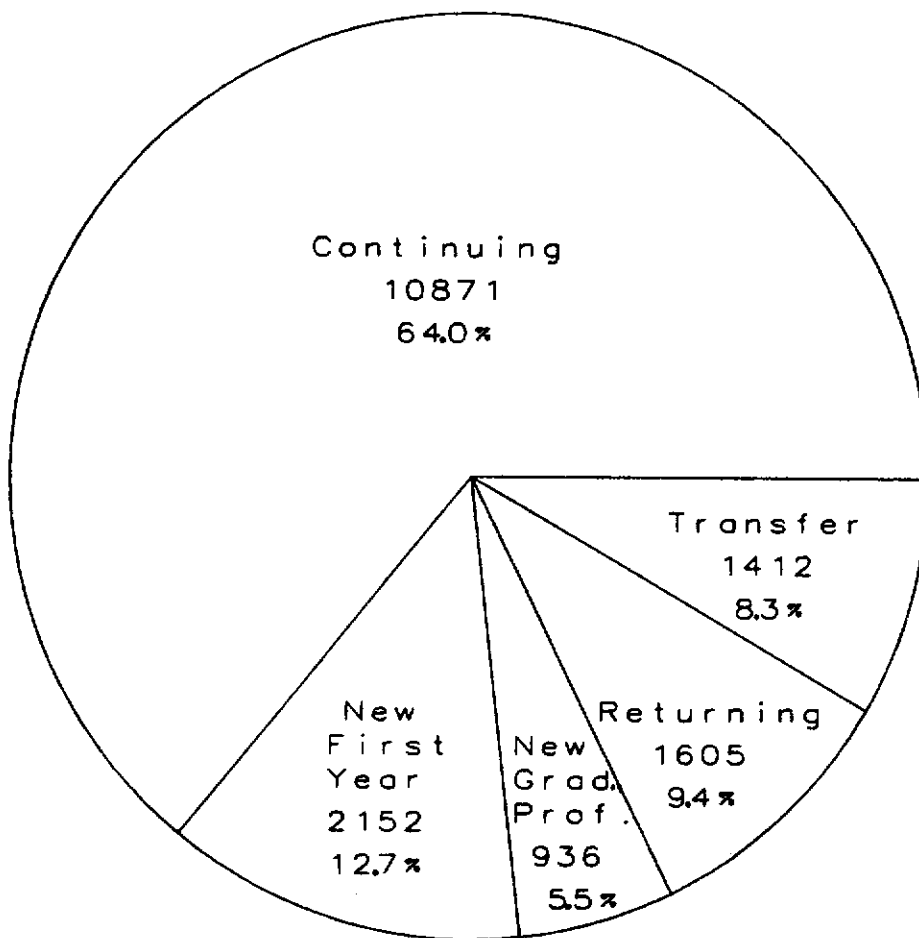

Entrance Status



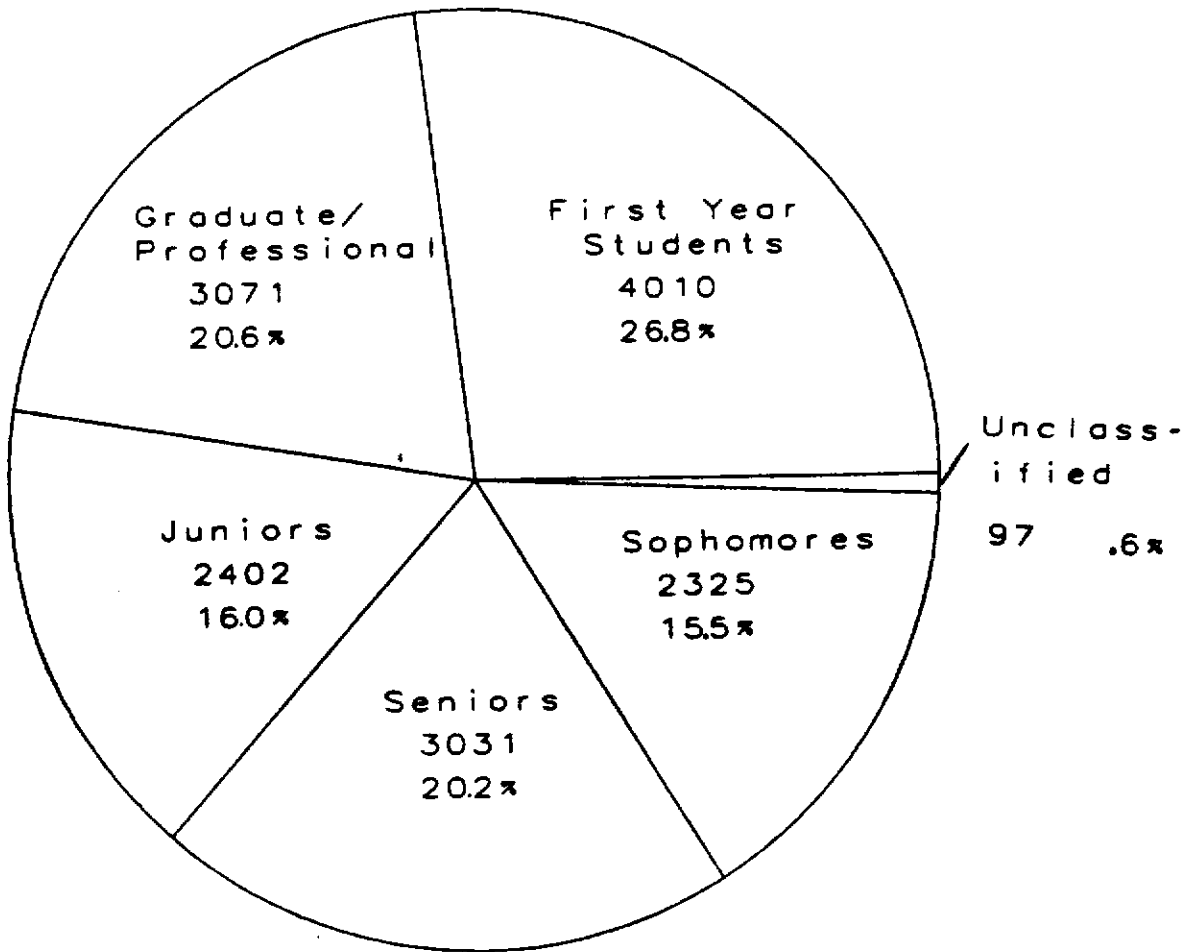

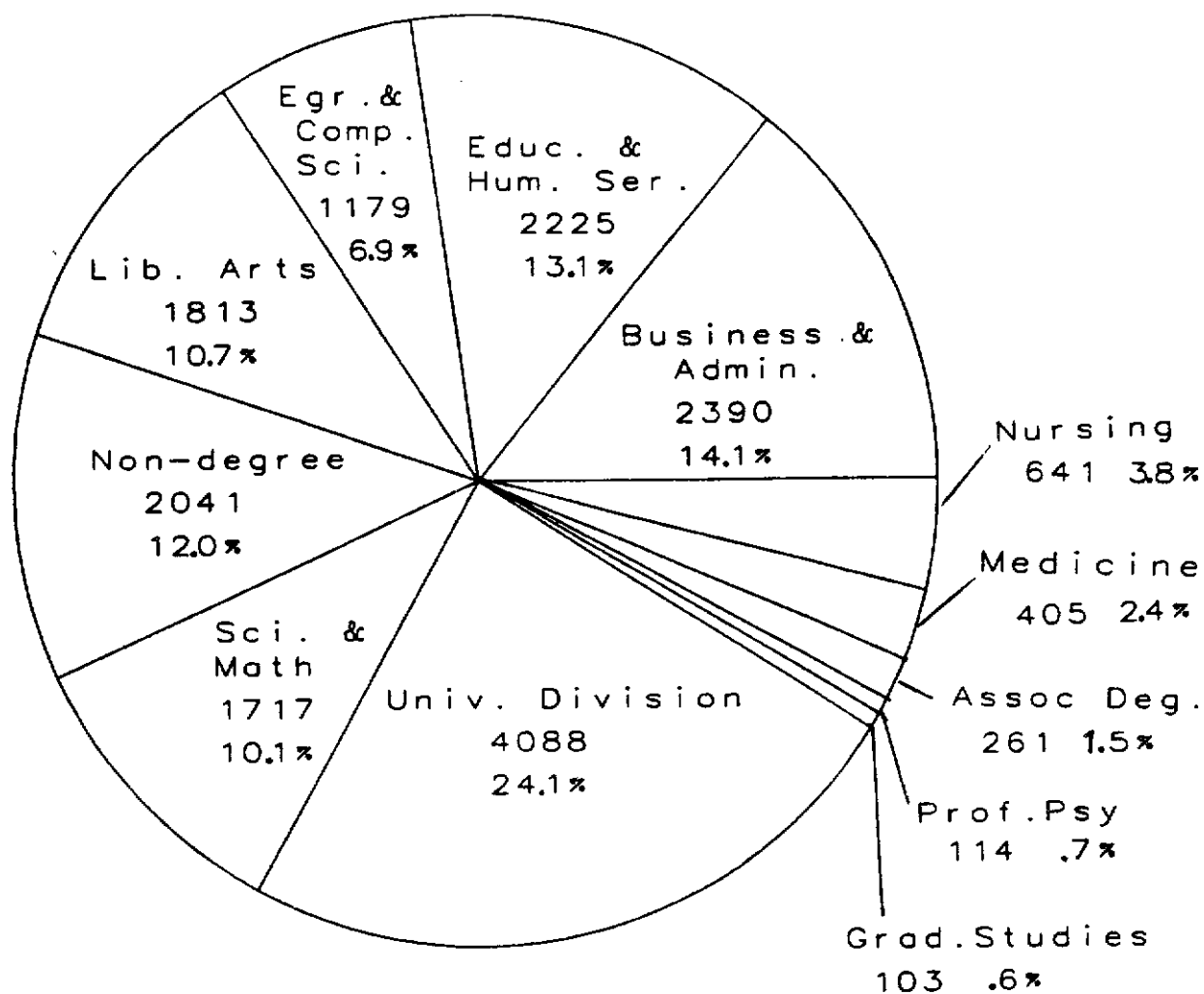

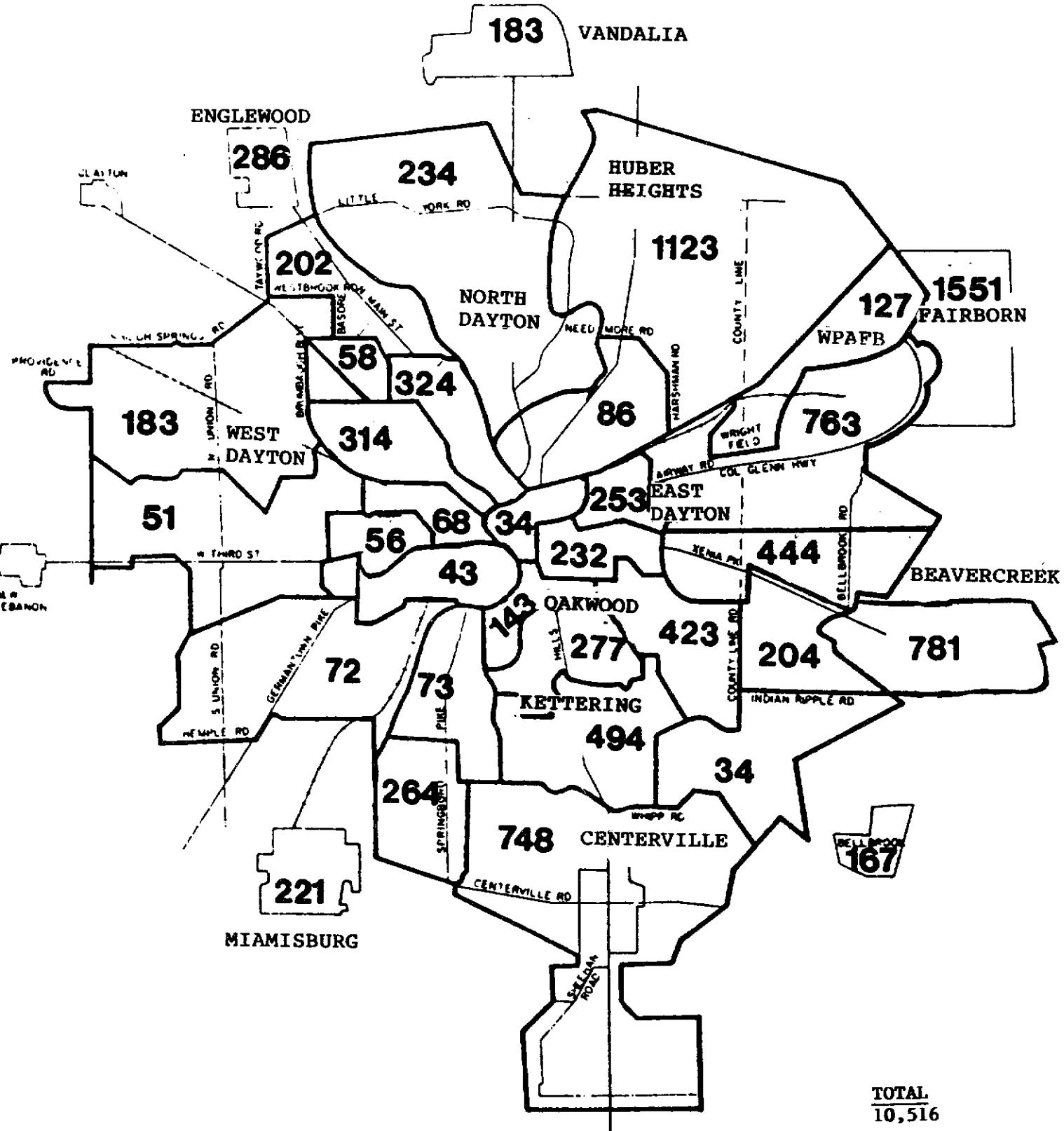

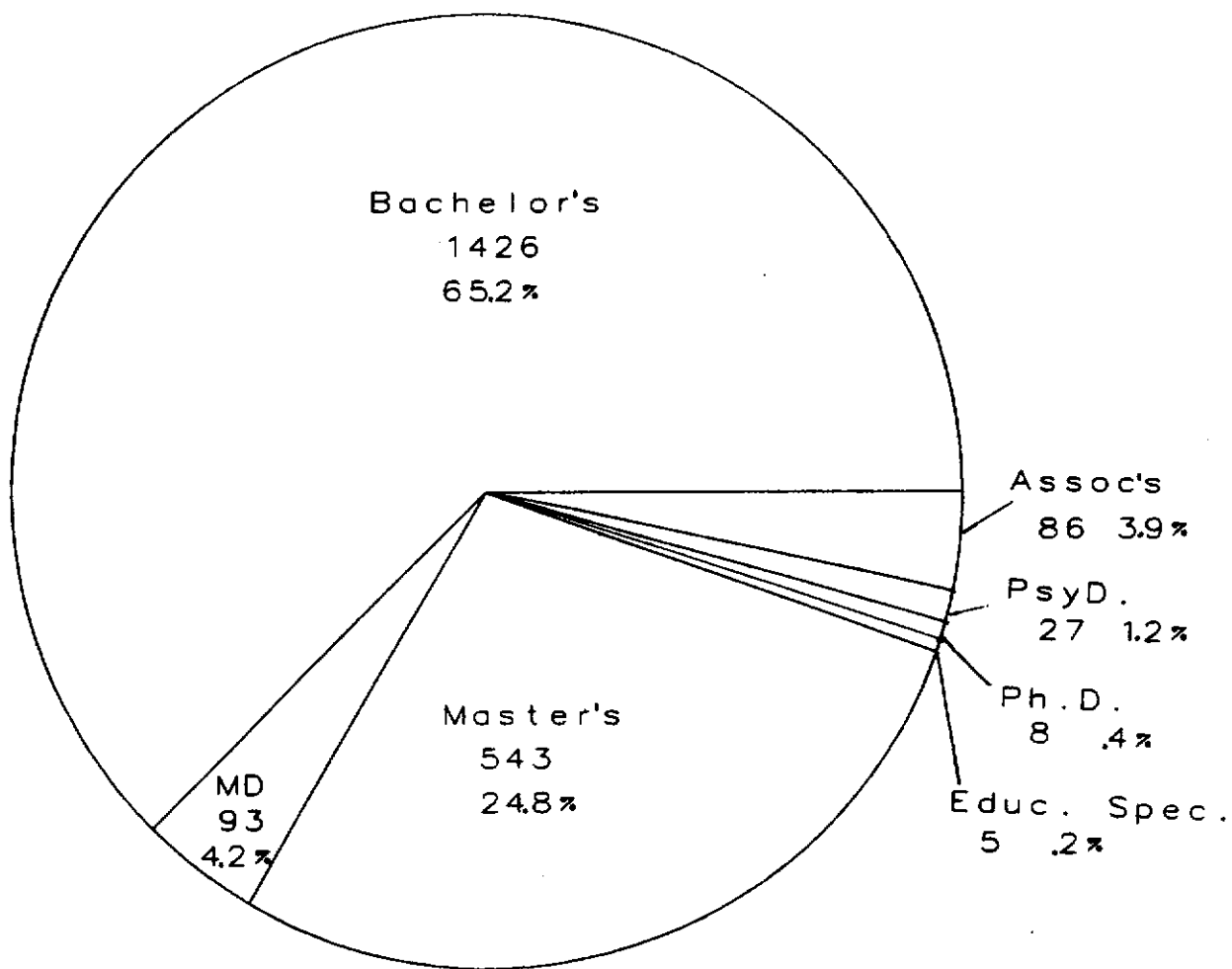
