Dear Madam:-

In the absence of Miss Susan B. Anthony, I will reply to your questions respecting work. I enclose the plan adopted by the convention in Brooklyn last November. It is, as you see, one involving a great deal of labor. The work we require of a lecturer is, first, to lecture; second, to organize a campaign committee, to take the petition books and pledge themselves to circulate them; also to send some one to the assessors books to obtain a true copy of the names of tax-paying women in their respective towns to gether with the valuation of the property for which they are asses; third, to ~~make~~ ^{for money} rousing appeals, and raise a good deal of it, "lots" as Miss Anthony says. To recapitulate. We want a speech, a campaign committee, (composed of people of character and responsibility), and we want money. Can you engage to do this think you? I shall I trust have the pleasure of meeting you in Washington.
