## Introduction

The Thirteenth Annual Student Fact Book (formerly Student Profile) contains demographic information about students at Wright State University.

Section I contains student data for the Fall Quarter of 1989. Information is also included on degrees awarded for the past year.

Section II contains longitudinal student data for 1984-1989.

Only data considered to be of general interest to the university community were selected for publication. Requests for other types of student data may be directed to the Student Information Systems office.

Twenty-five years ago, in September 1964, 3,203 students registered at the new campus. At that time, 39% of the students were full-time and 61% were part-time. Now 60% of the students are full-time and 40% part-time. In 1964 54% of the students were men and 46% women. Now 47% of the students are men and 53% women. Charts depicting the growth of the university through the years may be found on pages 76-78.

The Fact Book was prepared with the assistance of student researchers/statisticians Lee Mortimer, Tracy Brown and Gregory Thomas.

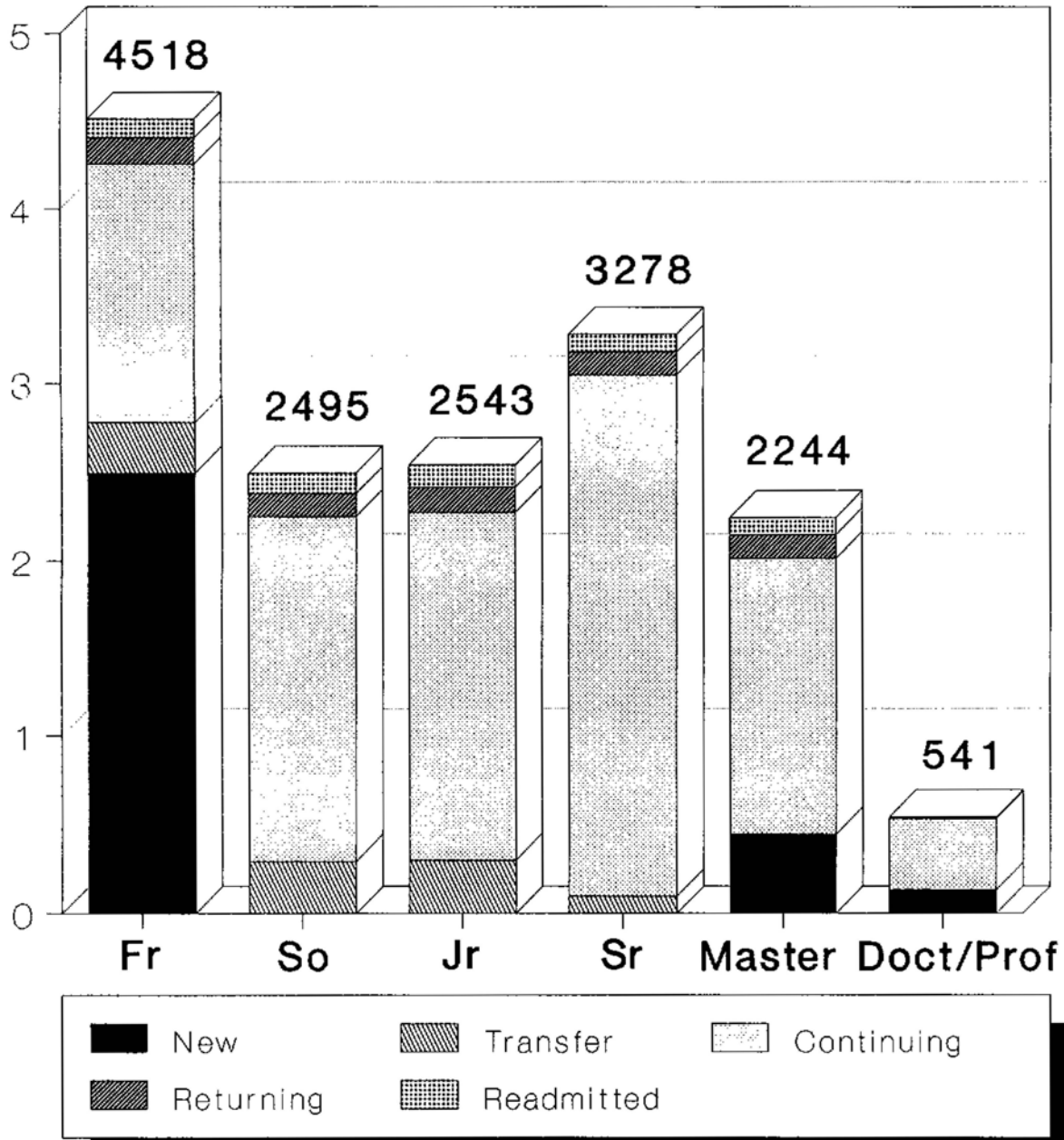

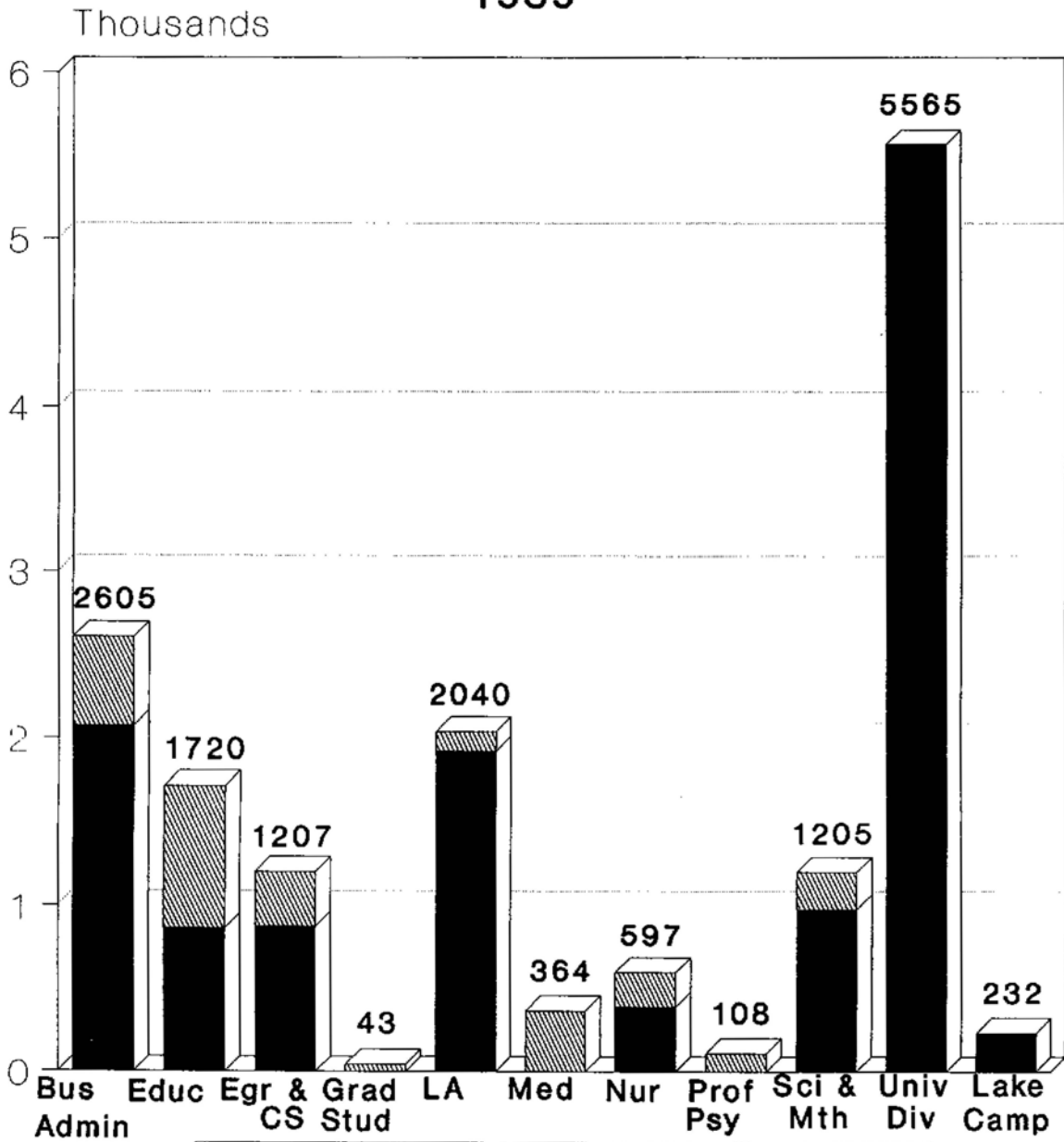
# Degree Students Entrance Status by Classification

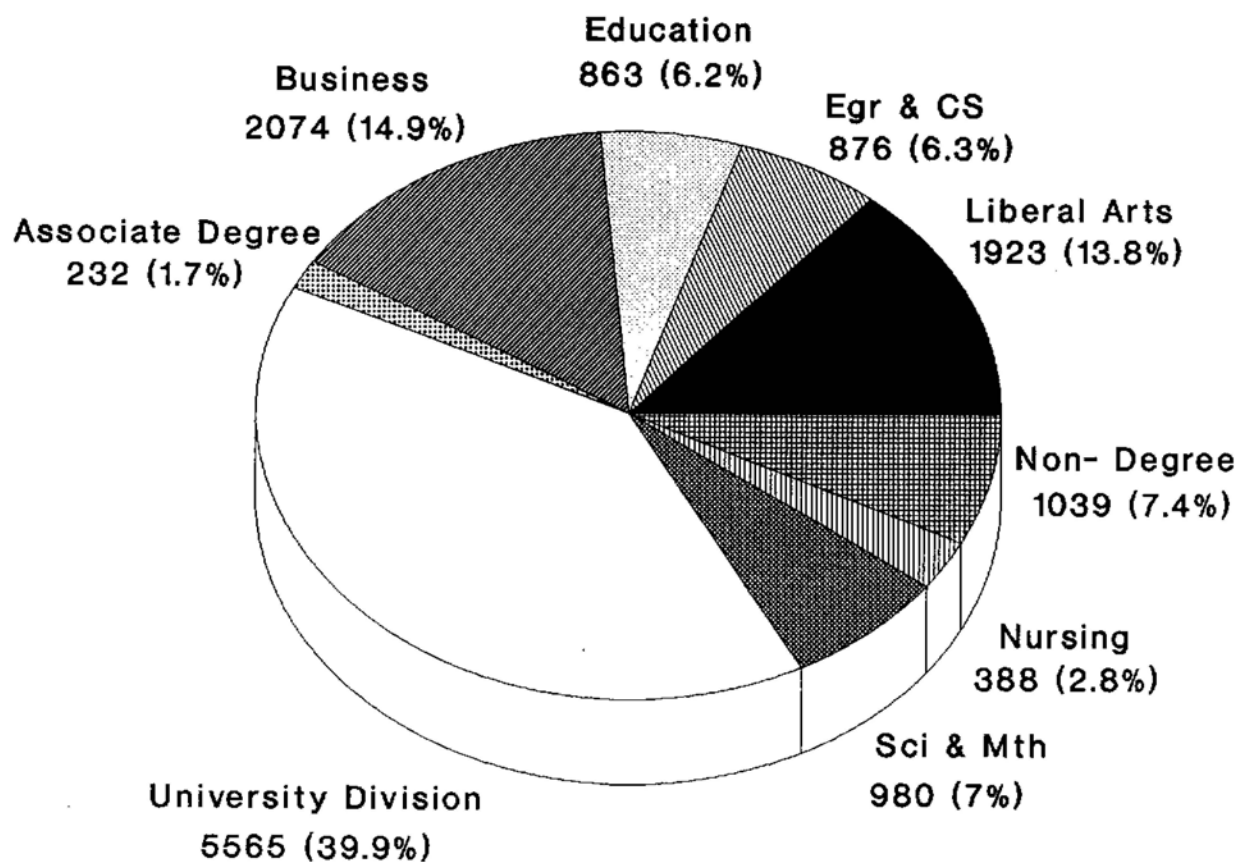

## Undergraduates Enrollment By College Fall 1989



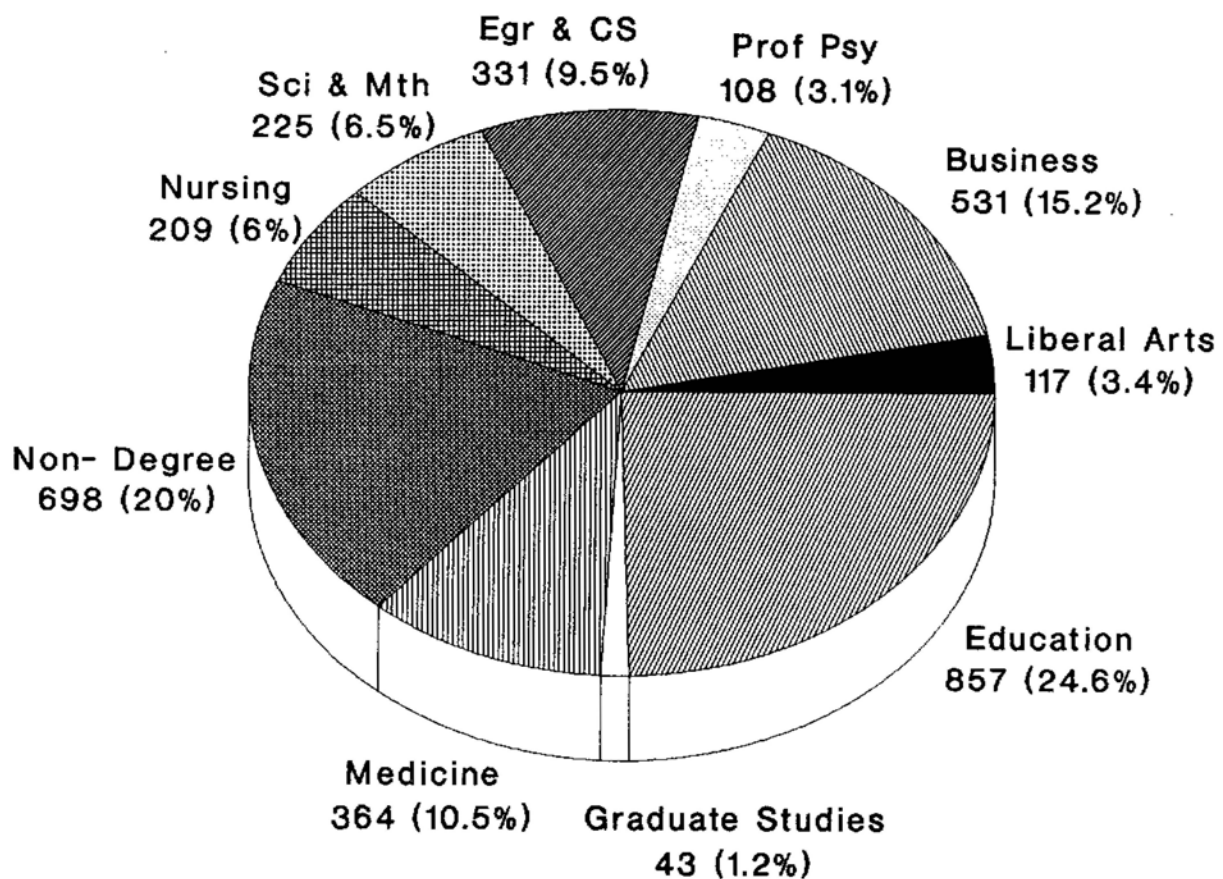

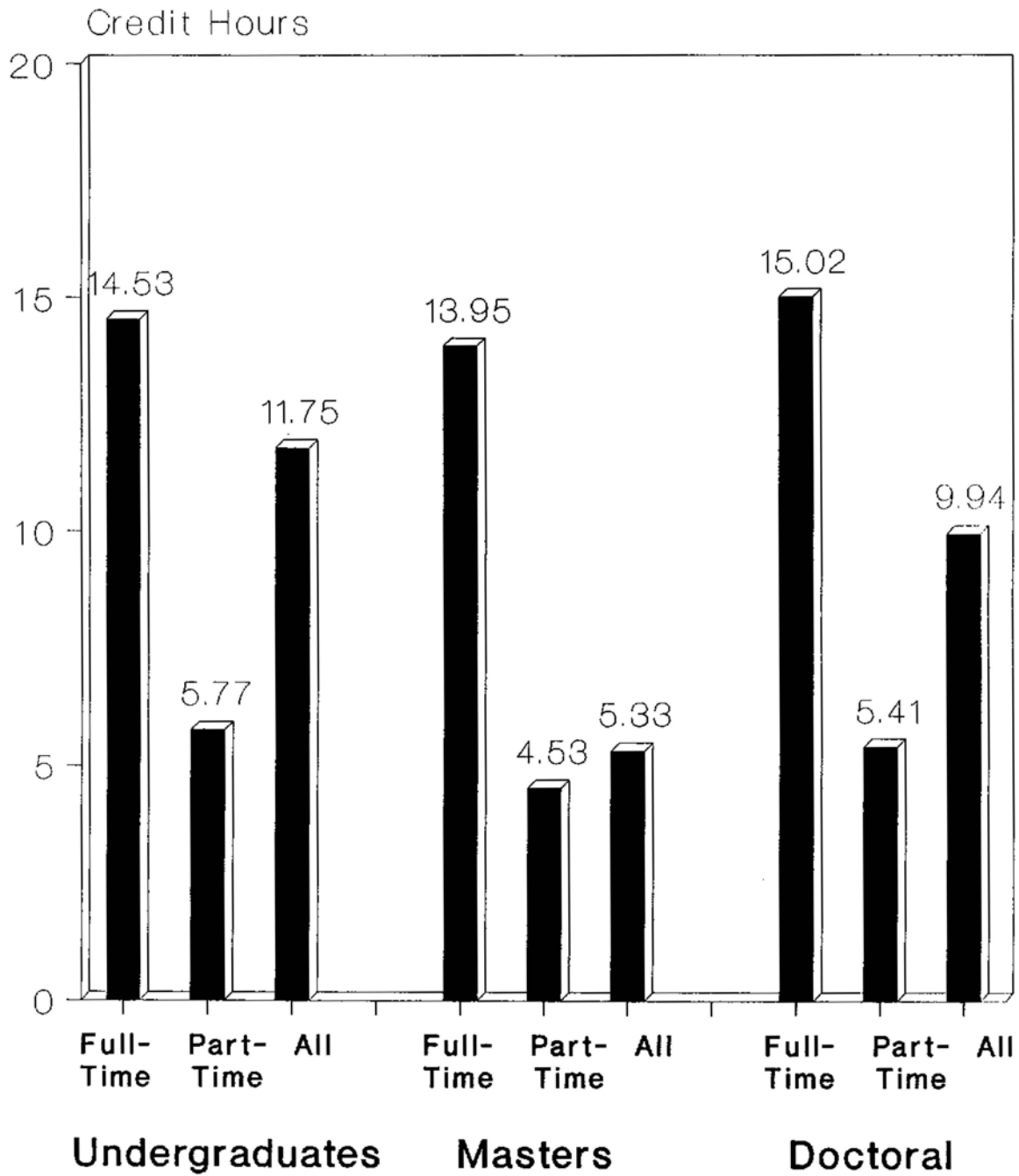

## Average Credit Hours Fall 1989



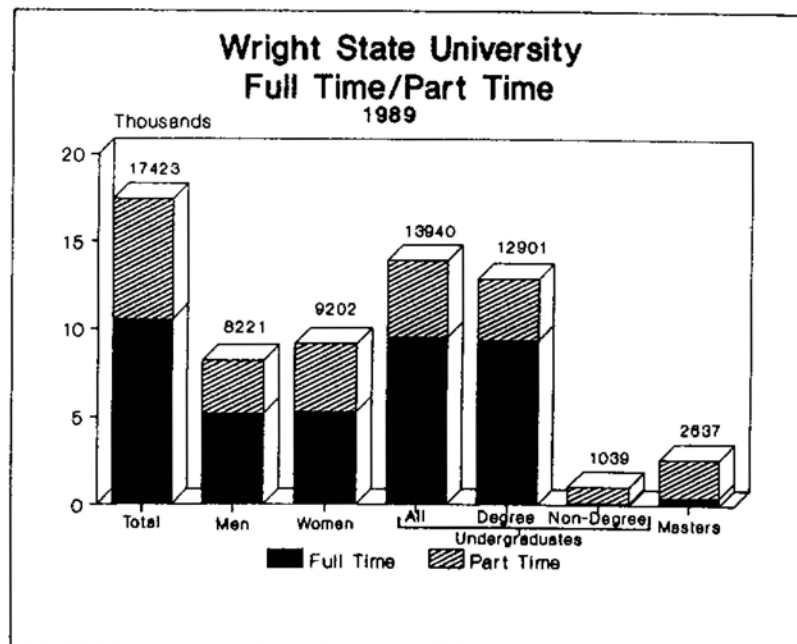

## Mean ACT Scores New Degree Freshmen Fall 1989

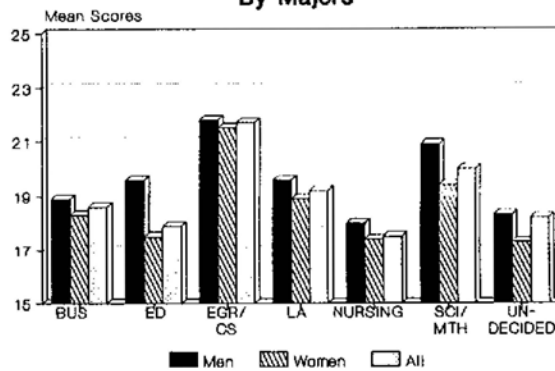
### By Sex

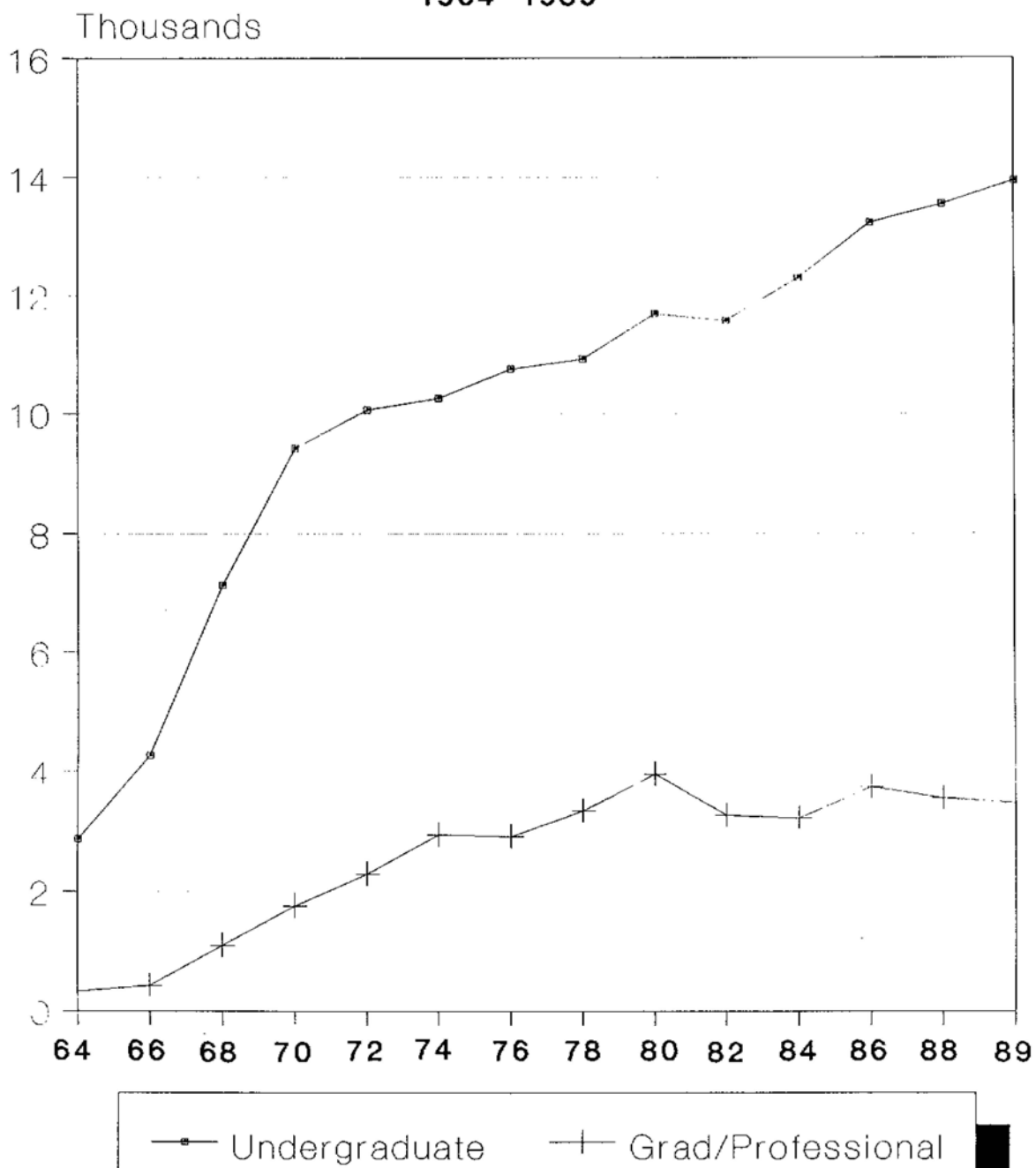
