The Miami Valley School was organized in the winter and spring of 1964, by a group of families and interested citizens who established a Board of Trustees, drew up a statement of philosophy and objectives, engaged a Headmaster, and raised funds projected towards obtaining suitable property and constructing school buildings.

The School began operations, Kindergarten through Grade Eight, under the new Headmaster, Mr. Walter Truslow, in September 1964. Classes were held for a total enrollment of 85 students, at a temporary facility on Munger Road; and for the primary children, in rented classrooms at the Southminster Church.

The new (and present) site was obtained prior to this time. Construction of eleven classrooms, a library, and office and utility space was completed and occupied by all students in April 1966. Enrollment at this time was 108.

Enrollment increased to 175 in the fall of 1966. It was quickly apparent that the second stage of construction was needed; and between July and December 1967, four more classrooms, a gymnasium-auditorium, and a fine arts room were added to complete the facility you now see. Enrollment next September is expected to rise to approximately 200-220 students.

The School, through this period of growth, change and adjustment, has persisted -- we believe -- in providing unusually thorough programs in the important academic skills; in sports; and in other useful activities -- maintaining excellent teaching in small classes.
