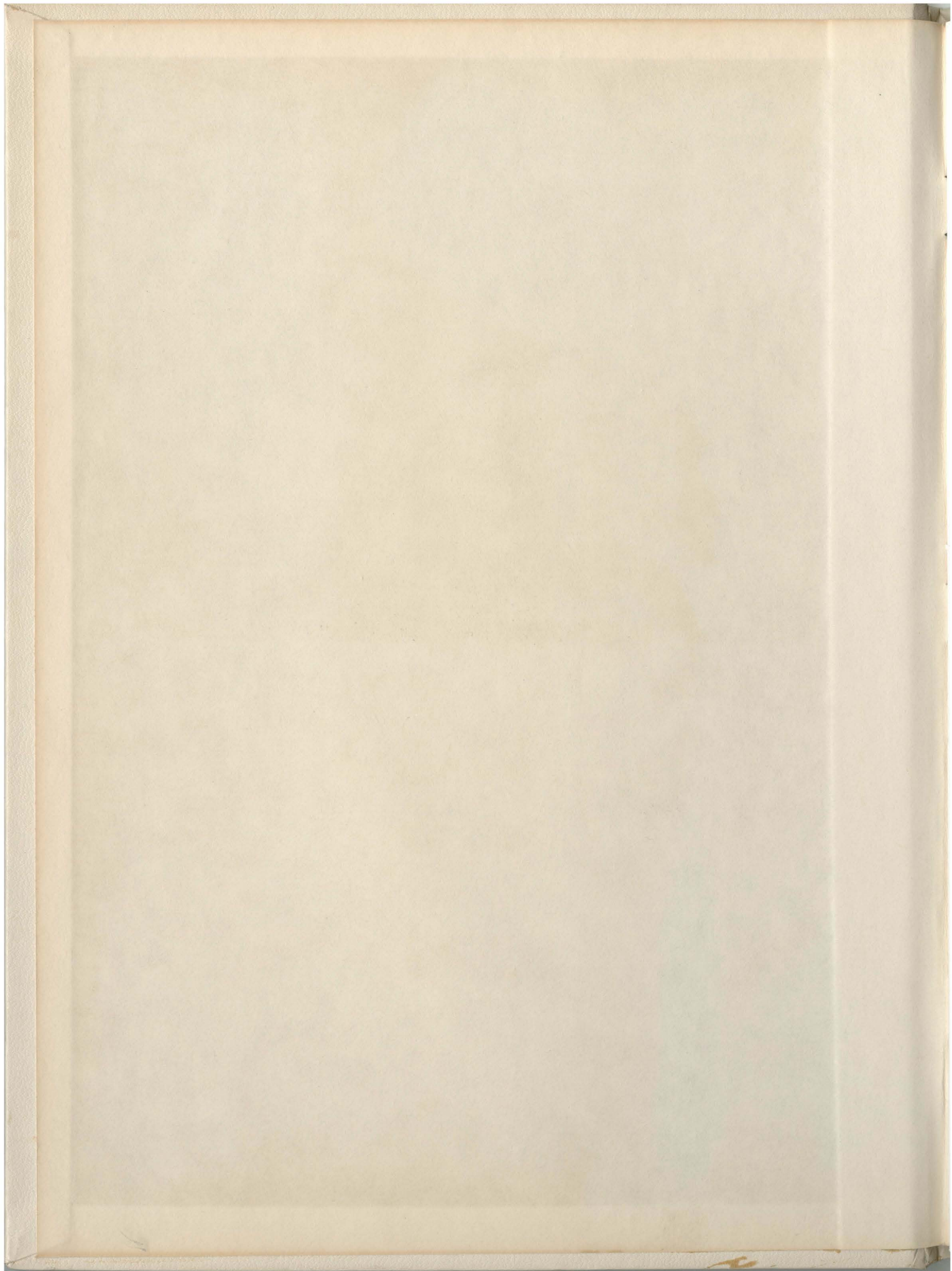

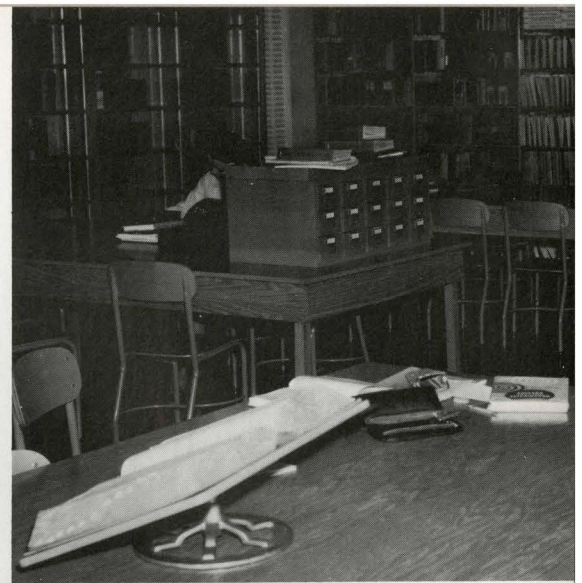
The purpose of the student council is to promote better relationship between the faculty and the student body. This year's Council has tried very hard to fulfill this purpose.
