## April 21, 2017: Weekly message from Interim President Curtis McCray

Dear Campus Community,

You are surely getting tired of my negativity; I know I am. One can only go so long being down on life, finding dysfunction in every aspect of one's existence. Melancholia is not pleasant; is very destructive if allowed to go on and on.

Well, why have I been so negative? Let me explain. When I was on campus in January, one of the complaints I heard most often had to do with the lack of accurate information, a sense that another administration had sugarcoated our problems and that we had been misled. Accordingly, I have determined to be as complete as possible in my descriptions of our financial mess; and this has required me to be very gloomy in my forecasts and in my efforts to communicate accurately.

Now, there's another side to all of this and it has to do with the university itself. When I spoke to candidates Schrader and Ford, I was careful to describe the assets and the liabilities of the university.
