How does this affect the planet?

- **Global Warming is causing the Earth's temperature to rise to such a degree where the polar caps are melting due to greenhouse gases produced by human activities.**
- **Key Plants for medicine would be decreased. For example, losing diverse insect species would decrease the plants' pollination. That would lead to key plants for medicine to go extinct.**

- **Air pollutions are increasing because of humans. Climate change stands to increase the levels of air pollutions made by humans, thanks to factors that are trapping sunlight.**




Why aren't people taking action to stop it?

- Fossil Fuels are cheaper than "greener" alternative methods for environment
- Global warming doesn't get proper media attention, unless a very important or famous name is backing it or against
- People tend to have trouble reteaching themselves along with having stubborn ideals when it comes to a largely controversial topic like global warming
- Most people believe that even if they try to help they will have little to no affect on the issue which leads them to not wanting to help or even try



World Agreements



- Kyoto protocol
 - Adopted December 11, 1997
 - Over 37 countries were apart of this agreement
 - Goal was to reduce 6 main greenhouse gases by 5.2% between 2008 to 2012; compared to 1997
- Paris agreement
 - Was put into act November 4, 2016; ahead of the original date
 - 175 countries signed the agreement
 - Goal was to have the world working together to lower greenhouse gases



Our solution

- Kinetic art turbines will allow us to gather solar energy from the solar panels on top of the fins and wind energy from the movement
- Make solar panels a common item for all houses and buildings
- For every one tree that is taken down we will plant two in reserves
- Utilize water turbines to gather wave power

Summary

- Our goal is to bring light to the destructive world of global warming and show the many ways to help limit its powers.
