Ohio County of Residence



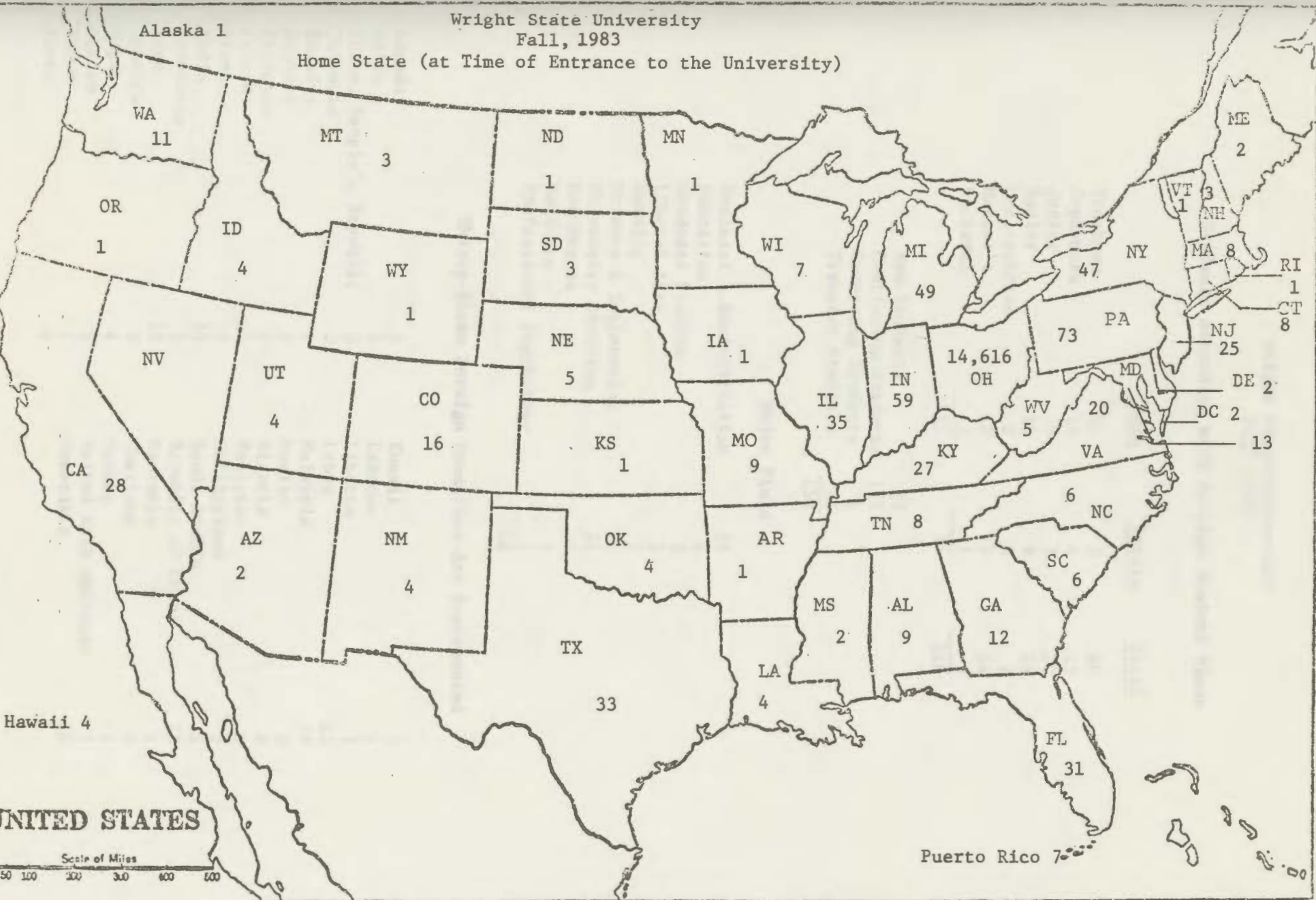

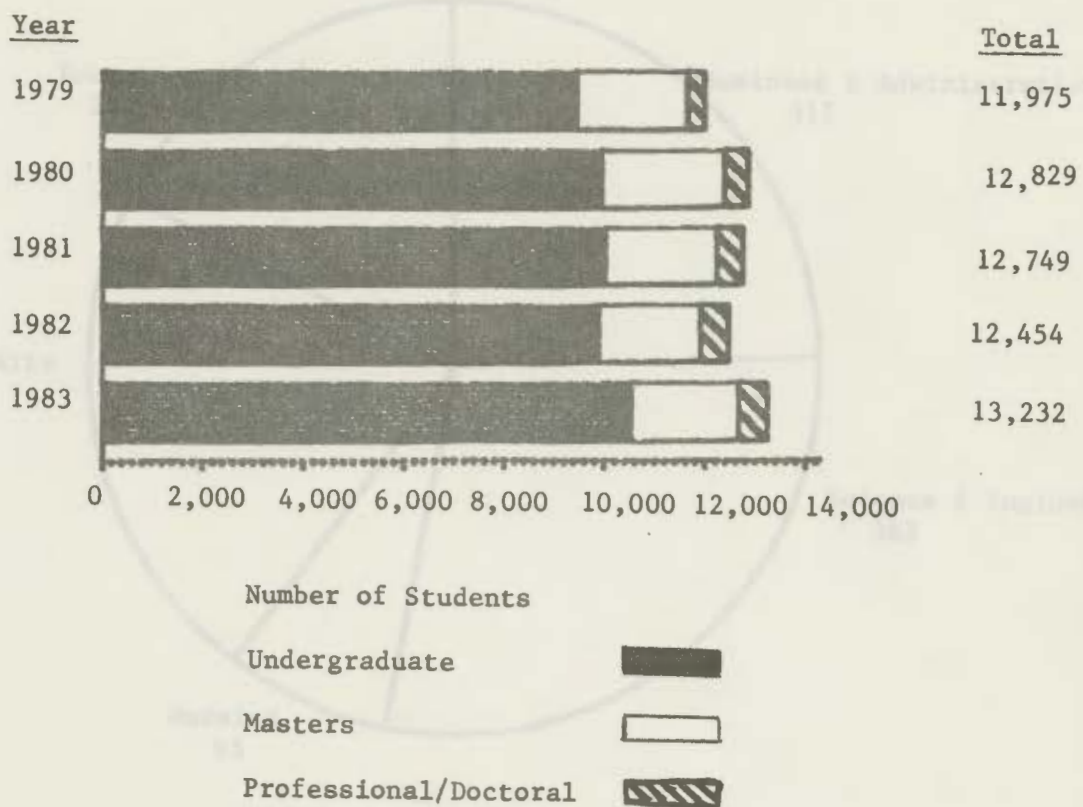
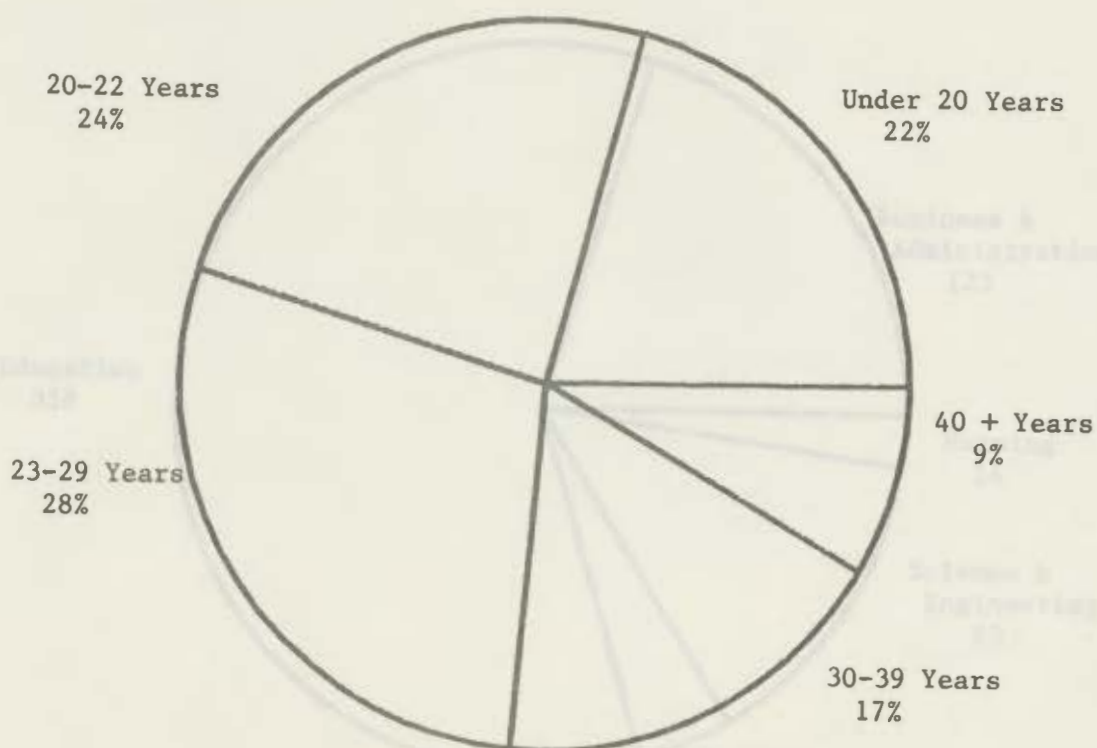
MASTERS/PROFESSIONAL/DOCTORAL ENROLLMENT



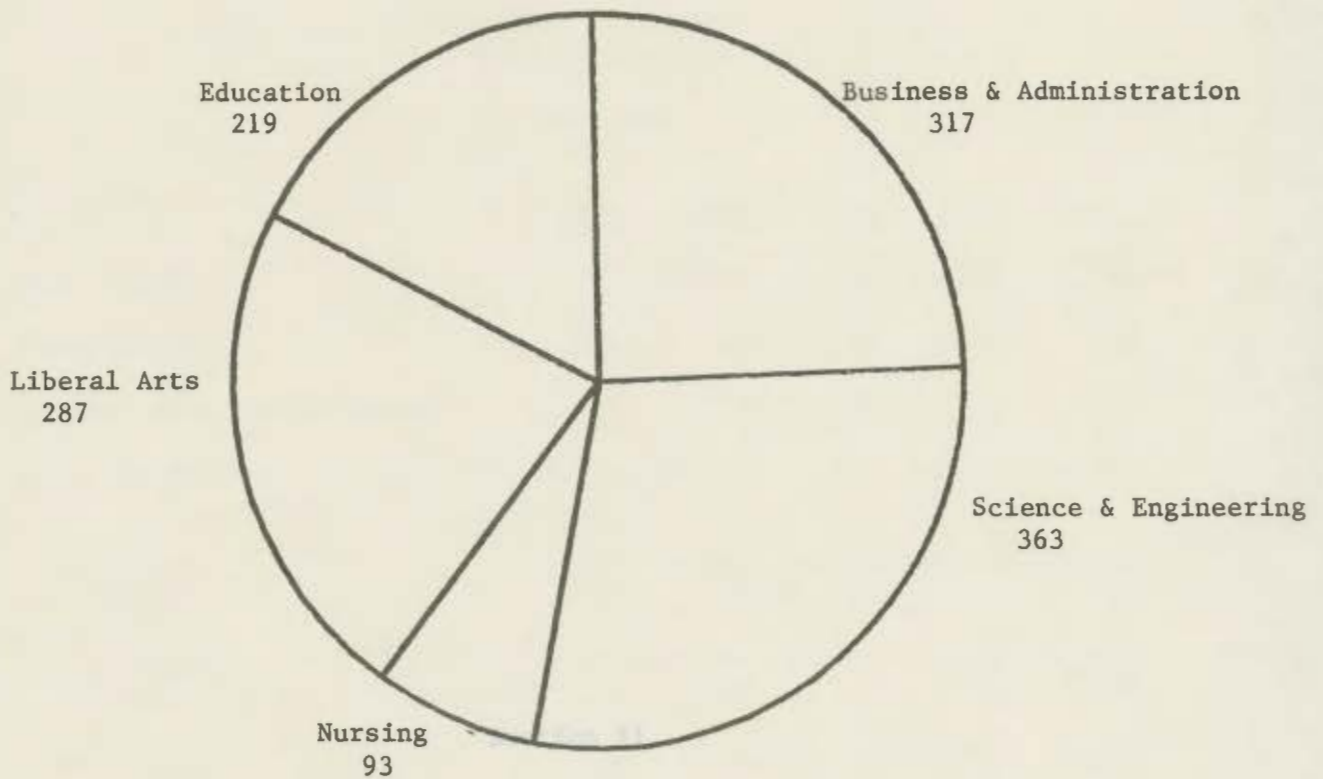

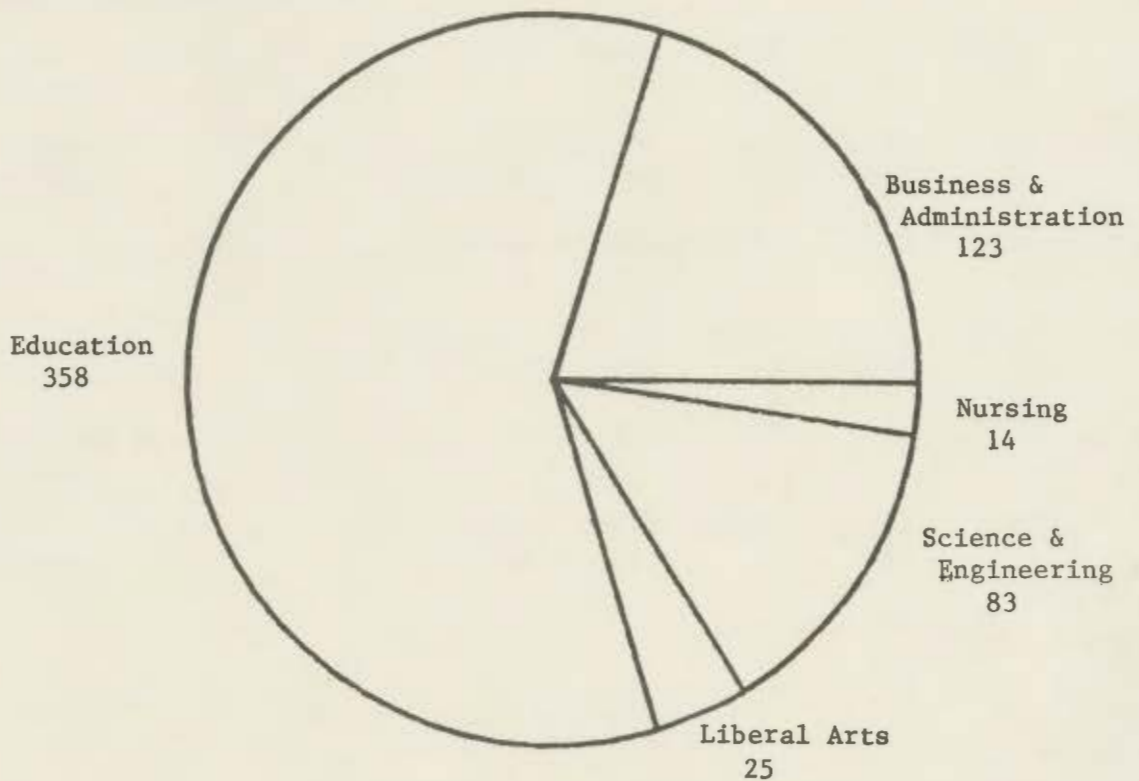
DEGREE ENROLLMENT FOR ALL CAMPUSES
