Camp at Franklin

I suppose you have seen the account of the fight. Our Regt lost six killed and about 39 or 40 wounded.

There is one one hurt that you know. all Yellow Springs Boys are safe -

I have no time to write the particulars.

We have fell back from Mc Dowell to Franklin -

I do not know what we will do next -

Nothing more

But am affectionately

Yr Obedt Servt

you see there is quite a difference in the date of this letter - part was written before the fight and this after it.

The fight was on the 8th of May
