In answer to our first letter telling of the Parade in Cleveland October 3rd, we have received enthusiastic responses from all over the State.

Help us in bringing before the voters of Ohio the true import of this great movement by showing them the thousands of women in every walk of life who, by their devotion and courage have given to the cause of Woman Suffrage the nobility of untiring endeavor and permanent good.

Help us in making the Ohio Parade the greatest demonstration of its kind ever seen in this country.

This is no time for lavish expenditure and drum corps instead of bands have been found impressive in other states. Bring your own drum corps with you if possible.

We are endeavoring to secure railroad rates but all arrangements for special trains etc. should be made at your local stations. Trains will be met by the hospitality committee.

Over night accommodations may be obtained from fifty cents a room up. A limited number may be entertained by local suffragists. Please let us know soon, so we may know what number to provide for.

Pioneer Suffragists will ride in the Pioneer Float. Kindly send us any names you may have.

Lunch will be served for out of town marchers. A bureau of information and checking facilities will be at Parade Headquarters. The County Banners used at Columbus in the Petition Parade will be used to head the Delegations.

A key to the Parade with street car instructions etc. will be sent out in the final bulletin of instructions about ten days before the Parade. Parade information and additional marching blanks will be used to head the delegations.

REMEMBER: We appeal to you, personally, to aid us.
