TRANSPORTATION.

Concerning the matter of transportation of delegates to and from Cincinnati, we desire to announce as follows:—

Immediately upon the determination of the place of holding the Convention, application was made in due form to all Traffic Associations asking for special rates.

The National Executive Committee has decided to place 1000 tickets at the command of Ohio Prohibitionists, and to divide the remaining tickets among the States in proportion to the number of delegates from each.

The more remote States will probably not call for all to which they are entitled, and in that event an increased number will be issued to those having a larger demand for them.

All Prohibition papers will contain during the week ending June 18th, a detailed statement as to the time and place of the distribution of these tickets. No State will have less than four tickets for each delegate, but no tickets will be sent by mail. Look for the announcement.
