Cousin Matter

Gours of the 29th ult-received yesterday evening- though severly able to sit-up this morning I will say and answer it - Far more than two weeks just - I have had the chills and fever evry day - and heavy night sweets every night I have taken a nast amount of medicineand jet even get nothing to wet upon them and brevh them up - The physicians say they are beetic chills-coursed by Schility-bost bloodand a generally diseased system- and very difficult to get eleve of-If I do not get them broken up soon-they will break me up entirely. Gesterdy afternoon I had but a slight edill- but about five hours of high fever-last night could not rest for coughing-spit-up some blood during the night- this morning I am so weath and dizzy hevded-I evn sevreel more about = I suppose I will hove another exill this afternoon- I am a great deal weather and power in plesh state when at your Louse - I am not worth a cent to amybody and with help to myself

I cannot find any physicions that seem to know anything about my disease or who treat me with any sneepall they do is done by way of experiment they suying that perhaps such and such results will follow-well- I um getting direct of femy experimented an - and that to - at the expense of my life -I am not from able to trivel- if I was I should stort and to find some une that seemed to understand my constition -I have tolen medicine enough during the jost month to either hill or eme a dagen men- and all to no purpose-I am now storying with Liggie in tois and have lun for over a week-her husband is in Ills un business- but will return the last of this week- I wish I mus luch in Ohio now- you need not be surprised to see me step in and these days- if I get the chills brokery and get able to trovel -I am still in the service - I heard the other day from my progers they were not drowning correctly in some porticulous and were not approved as soon as 2 get-alle to go to Indianaplis. I will send forward another paper and try it again-if I was any able to go to my Regit - I could oven get a resignation put through -
