Chair's Message



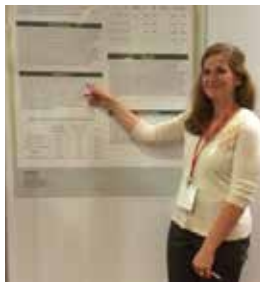

University Professor Award



Ron Markert, Ph.D., professor, Departments of Internal Medicine, Orthopaedic Surgery and Surgery was selected as University Professor by Wright State University Board of Trustees. This title is a special rank for full professors with outstanding contributions beyond the confines of the university, and there may be no more than one University Professor in a college or school simultaneously. There are only three recipients at any given time at the university and each recipient retains the title for five years.

Visiting Professor Lecture



Alan Lumsden, M.B. ChB, RVT, FACS, presented the September 3 John W. Berry Jr. Visiting Professor Lecture on "A CT in the OR: Really?" In 1991, Dr. Lumsden accepted a position as an assistant professor of surgery in the Department of Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine. In 1998, Dr. Lumsden became director of the Emory Endovascular Training Center and the Emory Venous Clinic in Atlanta. He was appointed head of general vascular surgery at Emory University School of Medicine in March 1999, where he served until November 2001. In December 2001, Dr. Lumsden was named professor and chief, Division of Vascular Surgery and Endovascular Therapy, Baylor College of Medicine. In January 2008, Dr. Lumsden was named professor and chairman, Department of Cardiovascular Surgery, Methodist DeBakey Heart and Vascular Center, The Methodist Hospital, and in January 2009, Dr. Lumsden was named medical director of the Methodist DeBakey Heart and Vascular Center.

Dr. Lumsden has developed an international reputation as a leader in the field of endovascular surgery. He has received more than \$1.8 million in support for his research,

which includes funding from the National Institutes of Health. Dr. Lumsden brings to Baylor his research team, which holds four current NIH awards. His work has resulted in more than 200 scientific articles, abstracts, books, book chapters, and more than 100 presentations.

Dr. Lumsden's clinical expertise is in stent graft treatment of thoracic and abdominal aortic aneurysmal disease, stenting and endarterectomy in carotid arterial disease, renovascular hypertension, aortoiliac occlusive disease, mesenteric vascular and minimally invasive therapy in venous disease. His research interests are in restenosis and developing newer methods of minimally invasive therapy.
