Saturday, January 1 Went to town in the morning. Susan, on account of indigestion, not able to eat turkey with us. Reuchlin & Lulu called in the evening. I busy preparing a sermon I did not preach, on "O Hearer of Prayer."

Sunday, January 2 Pr. at Summit Street Church at 10:30, Heb. 3:1, it being on quarterly meeting occasion. Communion followed. Rev. S.W. Keister, P.E., pr. at 7:00, Rom. 12:11. A good sermon.

Monday, January 3 At home. Wrote some letters. Heard Bishop J. Weaver pr at 7:30, Ps. 85:5. The meeting at Summit St.

Tuesday, January 4 At home. Called at Dr. Davis & Dillon's. Halleck Floyd called an hour or more.

Wednesday, January 5 Ate no breakfast, being unwell. Rev. H. Floyd came before dinner & staid a few hours. I did little to-day.

Thursday, January 6 At home all day. Rev. H. Floyd dined with us. Printed script circular letter to preachers on my district.

Friday, January 7 At home in forenoon writing & mailing letters. Went to town in the afternoon and got my watch, etc. New mainspring cost \$1.50 & guaranteed for one year. Reuchlin and Lulu called & spent the evening.

Saturday, January 8 At home all day. Got letter from Rev. J.W. Ingle giving a copy of McKee's second letter

to Rev. E.C. Wyatt, reflecting on Oregon conference.

Sunday, January 9 Attended Summit Street Church. Bp. J. Weaver pr. at 10:30, Ps. 37:3. In the evening Rev. G.M. Matthews pr. at 7:00 on Stoning of Stephen. Three mourners and all professed conversion.

Monday, January 10 Worked in forenoon on letter-writing to Coast preachers. Reuchlin & Lulu called a while in the evening.

Tuesday, January 11 Spent the day at home. Orville got his case of type pied in the evening.

Wednesday, January 12 Went to town in the forenoon. Orville printed circulars. Wrote letters in the afternoon. Called at Reuchlin's in the evening. Orville set and printed another circular—for Reuchlin.

Thursday, January 13 At home. At Summit St. Ch. at 7:00. Bp. Weaver pr. Rev. 22:17.

Saturday, January 15 Went to East Side of the river to make some purchases—bought Orville a suit of clothes for \$10.00. At home in the afternoon writing. Called at Dillon's; visited Dr. Davis.

Sunday, January 16 Heard Rev. H.J. Mulholland pr. at Miami Chapel, 1 1/2 miles south of my home which is No. 7 Hawthorne St., Dayton, Ohio, which I purchased of Jas. Manning & wife in 1870, and moved into early in 1871—February, I believe. Hear Rev. A.W. Drury pr. at 7:00, John 12:32, Summit St.

Monday, January 17 At home. Reuchlin and Lulu called in the evening a little while.

Tuesday, January 18 At home. Heard Bishop J. Weaver pr. at Summit St. at 7:30, Prov. 18:24. None forward for prayers.

Wednesday, January 19 At home. Largely engaged in mending up books that had come apart. Went to Miami Chapel and preached to a large congregation, 2 Cor. 5:14. Many under conviction, deeply.

Thursday, January 20 At home during the day. Went to Miami Chapel and pr. to a large congregation Matt. 19:27. Some deeply convicted.

Friday, January 21 Went on the early train to Richmond, Ind. Called at D.K. Zeller's. Went on to Decatur, Ind. Dined at Rev. Isa. Imler's. Supper and lodging at Rev. J.W. Lower's. At Evang. Asso. Church at 7:00 and heard Rev. Oakes pr. on "One thing needful." Rev. Stoop is pastor.

Saturday, January 22 Went with Rev. J.W. Lower and family to Glenmore, 12 ms East. Dine at Elias Dull's. Meet the trustees of Bethel Church at 2:00. Supper & lodging at D.N. Hey's. Pr. at 7:00, Ps. 1:6, the first sermon in the new church.

Sunday, January 23 Pr. at 10:30 the dedication sermon of Bethel Church, one mile south of Glenmore, Ohio Math. 6:9 and raised \$647.50 in subscription & cash and dedicated the church. Dine at W.G. Walters' 1 1/2 m. S.W. of Glenmore. Pr. at 7:00 Mark 8:36(?) Stay at Walters'.

Monday, January 24 Dined at Elias Dull's. Spent the afternoon at John W. Dull's & took supper there. He away. She a daughter of Rev. W.E. Bay. Bro. Lower & wife there. Pr. at 7:00, Mark 8:36(?). Congregation large. Stay at Elias Dull's, 1 1/2 m. north-west. Bro. Lower and Walters and wife there.

Tuesday, January 25 Meeting at 10:00, led by Rev. Michael Johnson. It was good. About 19 present. Dine at John Middaugh's 1/2 m. east of the church, with W.G. Walters and wife. Pr. at 7:00, Acts 3:19. Congregation large. Stay at John P. Hey's. She a strong "Radical." He

almost deaf. Lower with me.

Wednesday, January 26 Meeting at 10:00 led by Bro. Lower, 26 present. Dine at Wesley J. Walter's, 3/4 m. west of the Church, with Bros. Smith, Hurry & Lower. Supper at Franklin Dull's whose wife is a sister of W.G. Walter's wife & daughter of Smith's. Pr. at 7:00 at Bethel, Eph. 3:19. Stay at E. Dull's, with Bros. Hurry and Lower.

Thursday, January 27 Meeting at 10:00 led by Wm. G. Walters. 24 present. Dine at Solomon Kissel's 1 3/4 ms. north-west. She a member; he a confessor of the need of religion. Rev. J.W. Lower pr. at 7:00, Rom. 10:1. Stay at D.N. Hey's, close to the church.

Friday, January 28 The morning meeting at 10:00 was the best of all our day meetings. About 27 present. Dine with Lower at Jac. Smith's, 1/2 m. east. Also supper. Quite a rainy afternoon. Mrs. Smith is religious; he convicted. Pr. at 7:00 to a small congregation, Acts 16:31. Stay at John P. Hey's.

Saturday, January 29 Stay at Hey's till after dinner. Then go to D. Newton Hey's. Change clothes & bathe, as my custom for years, is. Pr. at 7:00, to a full house, Rev. 29:1. Young Fore comes as a seeker. Stay at D.N. Hey's with Bro. Lower.

Sunday, January 30 I address S.S. five min. Pr. at 10:30, Zech. 13:6. Dine at John Middaugh's with Rev. Michael Johnson, Wm. J. Walters & wife & Jac. Smith & wife & others. Rev. M. Johnson preached at 3:00, Isa. 35:8,10. Call at D.N. Hey's with Johnson, Chilcote, etc. Pr. at 7:00, Eph. 2:16. Four ask prayers. Stay at John Hey's.

Monday, January 31 Awake at 4:00. Breakfast early. Pas. train is earlier than we knew, so I go on accom. tr. to Marion, Ind. Arrived at 3:15. Mail letters to I. M. Tharp, Wilmore & D.G. Rush (Calif) there & on train home & one at Fairmount. Reach Fairmount at 9:10. Stay at Rev. A.J. Bolen's in parsonage with Littleton Davis, etc.

Tuesday, February 1 Call at Elwood Davis'. Walk on to Aunt Eliz Reeder's. Dine there. Remain in the afternoon, and till morning. Wm. Reeder comes in the evening and stays till bed-time. Robt. & Flora attend literary society at the school-house.

Wednesday, February 2 Go over via Henry Simon's and Levi's to W. Fine's, on my farm. Call at each of those places. Back to dinner at Aunt Reeder's. Write to Hoisington, Burns, and Bitner and to C.W. Wells. Supper at William's. Stay at Wm. H.H. Reeder's, Junior's. Balance Accts. He owes me \$29.25.

Thursday, February 3 Have three more loads of corn sold 277 bush (about) altogether. Call at Rev. A.J. Bolen's, Fairmount. Supper & lodging there. Pr. at Union Church, 2 miles S. of Fairmount at 7:00, Acts 20:21. Three seekers came to the altar.

Friday, February 4 Went on the 7:10 train to Jonesboro, and thence on the 10:08 train to Union City, and thence on the 2:15 train to Dayton, arriving at home about 4:30. Found all about as well as common.

Saturday, February 5 At home. Called to see Dr. L. Davis, in the forenoon.

Sunday, February 6 At home in the forenoon. In the evening I heard Rev. A.W. Drury pr. at Summit St. at 7:00, on "Almost and yet not accepting Christ as a savior." Three joined Church & seven had joined in the forenoon.

Monday, January 7 At home in the forenoon, writing. In the afternoon washed my pants, with Katie's help.

Tuesday, February 8 Went to town. Saw McKee about Geo. Keller's donation. Read the proceedings of the Mis. Ex. Com. since An. Meeting of the board. Looked up Oregon matters. Ella Shell, our domestic, grew cross & Mrs. Wright sent her off in the afternoon. Bought material for pants.

Wednesday, February 9 At home. Called at Dillon's in the evening. Wrote letters in the forenoon.

Thursday, February 10 Took Susan to town to get impression for a set of lower teeth, in forenoon. Called at Davis' and Dillon's in the evening.

Sunday, February 13 Attended Church on Broadway (New Light) and heard Rev. Watson, the pastor pr. Ps. 40:1,2,3, a good sermon. Heard Rev. Marion R. Drury

pr. at 7:00 at Summit St., 1 Pet. 4:18, a good sermon.

Tuesday, February 15 At home all day, except a short trip to town in the afternoon.

Friday, February 18 Called at Bishop J. Weaver's. Called at Rev. Wm. Dillon's. Left an article: "A Misconstruction."

Saturday, February 19 Went on the noon train to Richmond and Dublin, Ind. Supper at Halleck Floyd's. Pr. at 7:00 at U.B. Church, Eph. 3:19 to a very full house. Stay at the H. Floyd's.

Sunday, February 20 Pr. at 10:30, Ps. 92:8. One seeker. Dine at Dr. G.W. Champ's. Stay till after supper. Pr. at 7:00, Luke 18:27. Five seekers and conversions. One joined. Stay at Joseph Gray's, with Rev. C.B. Small, the pastor.

Monday, February 21 Missed the early train. Breakfasted at Gray's. At meeting at 9:15. Dine at Rev. Halleck Floyd's. Go on 1:00 train home. Floyd with me. Arrive at 3:30.

Tuesday, February 22 At home. Wrote to W.H.H. Reeder. Floyd dines with us, and is with us occasionally during the week, at meals & lodging.

Wednesday, February 23 At home. Went to town in afternoon.

Thursday, February 24 At home. Declined going to the Council & Ex. Com. meeting of the radical brethren.

Saturday, February 26 At home. Went to town in the afternoon.

Sunday, February 27 Got ready too late to go to church in the morning. At home during the day. Reuchlin dined with us, as usual. In the evening at Summit Street Church heard Rev. G.M. Matthews pr. Luke 15:20, "And kissed him." Rather miscellaneous.

Monday, February 28 Went to town awhile— got some articles & saw Dr. Sample about "Mother's" teeth. Called at I.K. Gra[y]bill's in the evening & at Rev. Wm. Dillon's.

Tuesday, March 1 Changed from soft to hard coal & cleared up my room. Wrote an article for the Conservator, "A Creed on Wheels."

Wednesday, March 2 Called at W. Dillon's and at L. Davis's. Talked with G.W. Funkhouser in the evening on Oregon matters.

Thursday, March 3 At home all day. Wrote letters to L. Hoisington, C. Bitner, J.W. Ingle, J.W. Pulley, W. Fine, W.H.H. Reeder— Mrs. M.R. Drury & McHenry called in the afternoon a few minutes to see Susan.

Friday, March 4 At home all day. Wrote some letters. Called at Reuchlin's in the evening an hour.

Saturday, March 5 Rev. Halleck Floyd called an hour in the morning. Went to I.K. Graybill's & after an hour to W. Dillon's. McKee's letter for publication. H. Floyd dined with us and staid till morning. Reuchlin spent the evening till bed time with us.

Sunday, March 6 With H. Floyd heard G.M. Matthews pr. on Trial of Abraham's faith. Floyd dines with us. He went in Aftn. to W. Dillon's. Reuchlin staid to supper. Went in evening to hear Rev. P. Deveun pr. at First Pres. Church Rev. 22:17, "Spirit & bridesay," etc.

Monday, March 7 Went to town with Katie shopping. Called at Dr. L. Davis's. H. Floyd with us for dinner. Bro. Leo. Keller called an hour & more in the evening.

Tuesday, March 8 At home. Read some. Wrote to John McLaren. Sen'r at Eureka, Cal. Pretty day. Needed no fire at noon. Rev. H. Floyd called an hour or less in the evening to get paper, etc.

Thursday, March 10 Went to town & got Mrs. Wright's new teeth. Finished Article on "Flattering the People." Called at Dr. L. Davis' in the evening.

Friday, March 11 At home. Studied some on sermons in the forenoon and also in the evening. Rev. H. Floyd called in the afternoon. Also Mrs. Jas. Fleenor and Mrs. Schenck, formerly of Piqua, Ohio.

Sunday, March 13 Pr. at Summit St. Church at 10:30, 2

Pet. 1:16. Reuchlin dines with us, as he has done for some weeks. Revs. Floyd & Dillon call in the afternoon. Hear Rev. G.M. Matthews pr. at 7:30, Rev. [blank]

Monday, March 14 Went to "town" & got \$100.00, the last payment of the year from McKee. Got a letter also with a draft from Wm. H.H. Reeder for 89.10.

Tuesday, March 15 At home. Spent the day on notes on my address for "Congress of Churches & Christians," at Chicago.

Wednesday, March 16—Thursday, March 17 At home. Spent the time largely in classifying the notes for my address.

Friday, March 18 Wrote on my address about the whole day— my address for the "Congress of Christians," at Chicago. Rev. H. Floyd took supper with us.

Saturday, March 19 Read in the Century Magazine much of the day. Rewrote on my address in the evening.

Sunday, March 20 Heard Rev. J.W. Hott D.D. pr. Math. 27:37. He spoke 56 minutes. Heard Rev. Thorn pr. at 7:30.

Tuesday, March 22 At home. *Rel. Telescope* full of bitterness comes to hand. Prof. Funkhouser comes in the afternoon.

Wednesday, March 23 Reuchlin finishes packing goods and starts afternoon for Birmingham, Alabama. He shows fine gifts in writing and planning in matters of public interest. We were sorry for him to go so far away.

Friday, March 25 Went to town in forenoon & handed in the Telescope, "Defense of Oregon Conf." Wrote a little on my Address for the Congress of Churches.

Saturday, March 26 Went over to town & read proof of article. Spent Afternoon & evening in transcribing my address.

Sunday, March 27 Heard the presiding-elder, Rev. S.W. Keister preach a good sermon, John 12:32. About 2:00 took Sacrament. At home in the afternoon and evening.

Monday, March 28 At home all forenoon. Went to town in the afternoon and got Telescope. Called at W. Dillon's & Dr. L. Davis' in the evening.

Tuesday, March 29 Worked on my address some. Started at 6:00, p.m. for Chicago. Called an hour at D.K. Zeller's with Rev. Wm. Dillon. Rev. John McFall joins us on 9:45 train & Revs. Z. McNew and O.L. Wilson at Washington (Greensfork). Revs. C.B. Small & J.M. Kabrick afterward. Slept 4 hrs.

Wednesday, March 30 Pres. C.H. Kiracofe joins our company at Crossing. Arrive at Chicago about 7:30. Breakfast. Call at Chr. Associ. Rooms, 221 W. Madison St. Take rooms at 156 Clark St. Dine at 164 Madison St. Congress of Churches & Christians meet at 9:30. C.W. Richard temp. Chm. Pres. H.H. George, D.D. perma. Chm. Addresses: 1 H. Floyd 2. E.D. Bailey 3. Rev. N. Wardner 4. Rev. John Grunirt 5. Pres. George 6. Rev. L.A. Johnston.

Thursday, March 31 Addresses: Revs. C.F. Hawley & W.H. French. Afternoon: Adds. Rev. B.F. Roberts & Pres. J. Blanchard Evening Addr's. M. Wright & Pres. E.H. Fairchild, Berea, Kentucky. The Convention was a very good one.

Friday, April 1 Start home on 7:30 train with John Fall. Waited 4 hours at Logansport. At Marion write several letters. Reach Fairmount about 9:00. Stay at the parsonage with Rev. A.J. Bolen.

Saturday, April 2 Bra. Bolen takes me to Aunt Lizzie Reeder's, 5 m. S.E. of Fairmount. Wm. & I go to the farm. Supper at William's. Stay at Aunt Lizzie's.

Sunday, April 3 Robert Reeder took me to Union Chapel 4 miles west. I Pr. 1 Cor. 13:13. Go back to Aunt Lizzie's for dinner. Oliver Glass, there. Stay at Wm. H. H. Reeder's (Jun.).

Monday, April 4 Went to Fairmount. Sold my corn. Called at Rev. A.J. Bolen's to get my valise; also at Elwood Davis's. Went on 11:30 train to Anderson & thence on 3:10 train to Richmond. Supper with Dillon at D.K. Zeller's. Went on to Dayton arriving about 9:00.

Wednesday, April 6 Went to town with Susan & got her new teeth after their being worked over. In the evening, call at Wm. Dillon's on business.

Thursday, April 7 At home all the day and sad, for our second son started away at 6:00 p.m. for Kansas City & Wichita.

Friday, April 8 At home. Read a good deal, not being well enough to write much, owing to overdoing my nerves with mental employment.

Saturday, April 9 Get Ready to go to Indiana. Start at 11:45 to Mt. Pleasant Church, Randolph Co., Ind. Called about an hour at D.K. Zeller's at Richmond. Rev. W.T. Boice met me at Johnson & took me to Sam C. Morrison's, 1 1/2 m. S. of Church. Supper & lodging there. Br. Boice pr. at 8:00, Jas. 1:27.

Sunday, April 10 I pr. at Mt. Pleasant, at 10:30, 2 Cor. 8:9, took up mission Collection \$10.00. Dine at Joseph Alexander's. His daughter has scarlatina. I sat for hours in her room. Pr. at 7:30, Matt. 12:30. Stay at Alexander's. His wife is a daughter of John Coblenz, near New Paris, Ohio.

Monday, April 11 Bro. Alexander took me to Johnson. Reach Richmond about 9:30. Dine at D.K. Zeller's. Go on 1:45 train to Dayton.

Wednesday, April 13 Went to town. Whistler, the Theo. Student, called in the evening after 4:00. I called at Wm. Dillon's and Dr. L. Davis' in the evening.

Thursday, April 14 At home in the forenoon. In afternoon, I went to meet Ex. Com. (Missions) to represent my district. I Call at W. Dillon's & Dr. Davis'.

Saturday, April 16 Wrote letters in the forenoon. Went in afternoon shopping. Wrote letters in the evening.

Sunday, April 17 Attended Park Street Presbyterian Church in forenoon. It was communion day. There was baptizing of one; reception of several into Church; a short address on Christ's Glorification, etc. Rainy day & evening. Staid at home, evening.

Tuesday, April 19 At home. Made some notes for dis-

cussion. Saw Myers in the evening about Reuchlin's rent. Found Whistler had not paid it. Went to see Wh. but he away. Called a few minutes at Dr. Davis's.

Wednesday, April 20 At home. Called in the evening to see Melvin Brown about buying my lot & house. He not at house. Called to see Myers about Reuchlin's rent.

Thursday, April 21 At home writing an article for the *Telescope*.

Friday, April 22 Sent in my article in reply to McKee's last on Oregon Conference.

Sunday, April 24 Went to High St. U.B. Church. Heard Rev. J.W. Kilbourn pr. a Missionary sermon from Mark 16:19. W. Dillon called in the evening, an hour.

Monday, April 25 Went to town to see freight agent on making arrangements for Reuchlin. Wilbur ships Reuchlin's goods to Birmingham, Alabama.

Thursday, April 28 Received a letter from Lorin, who is at Cold Water, Kansas. Wrote him & mailed letter at p.o. in the afternoon.

Saturday, April 30 At Home. Orville & Katie went botanizing.

Sunday, May 1 Heard Prof. G.A. Funkhouser pr. baccalaureate sermon, Acts 20:28-35. Bishop N. Castle pr. at 7:30, 2 Cor. 5:20 "I Christ's Stead."

Monday, May 2 Board of Bishops meet at 9:00, and again at 1:30. Bishops Dickson, Castle, and Kephart at supper with us. Literary Societies exercises at 7:45.

Tuesday, May 3 Board of bishops meet at 9:00, and again at 1:30. I dine with the other bishops at Bishop Weaver's. Washington Gladden lectured on Carlisle at Sum. at 7:45. Quite interesting.

Wednesday, May 4 Graduating exercises at 9:30. L. Bookwalter, S.E. Glanden, W.B. Hartzog, Miss Ella Niswonger, R.L. Swain, C.A. Thorn, Chas. Hyer, J.H. Whistler, & W.H. Wright graduated. Go to town in the afternoon and do considerable trading.

Thursday, May 5 At home in the forenoon. Went on 3:40 train to Springfield and thence on St. Cars to Lagonda. Home at Lawrence's. Miss. Board Session at 7:30.

Friday, May 6 At Board Session. Mis. Secretary read his report, also the Missionary treasurer. Ex. Com's report read in the afternoon. Item on Oregon & N. Mich. referred to Com. Kephart, Dickson, & Castle. Mis. Meeting at night. I met Com. on Oregon at 7:00.

Saturday, May 7 Met Com. again at 7:00 AM. "Ex.Session" at 8:00. Warner's Case up. Public session about 10:00. I met Com. on Oregon at 1:00. Close the investigation. In afternoon, their *report read and adopted. Appropri. made "Ex. Session" in evening. Warner resigns. *Com. on Oregon reported in my favor.

Sunday, May 8 Rev. J. Hill pr. Annual Missionary Sermon at 10:30. Bish. Dickson dines with us. Bish. E.B. Kephart pr. at 7:30 Matt. 16:18, a labored effort. Stay as usual at Lawrence's who were very friendly and kind.

Monday, May 9 Miss St. Cars "one square," and walk to Springfield p.o. Went three squares out of the way & missed the C.C.C. & I. train one square! Buy an umbrella \$2.50. Go on 11:00 train to Dayton. W.H. Whistler & Miss Rohrer on train. Wrote letters. He married her later.

Thursday, May 12 At home. Wrote letters. In morning wrote "Honor to Whom Honor," for the *Telescope*. Took a brief article "Honor to whom Honor" to the office.

Friday, May 13 Wrote out a new form of deed for Ellis Wright, in the forenoon. Went to town with Susan and acknowledged the deed and mailed it in a registered letter.

Saturday, May 14 John Dodds called a half hour, in the forenoon.

Sunday, May 15 I Pr. at High Street Ch. Rom. 5:8. Dine with the pastor, Rev. J.W. Kilbourn. Visit Rev. I.L. Buchwalter, at Prof. A.W. Drury's, on Second Street. At home in the evening.

Monday, May 16 At Home. Called a half hour at Dr. L. Davis.

Tuesday, May 17 Went to Mission Rooms & got a draft for \$200.00. Saw Chas. W. Miller at the rooms. His son Dan. living at Miamisburg, Ohio.

Wednesday, May 18 Went to "town" in the afternoon. Bought a draft on Nat. Chemist's Bank, New York, No. 101493, I think & sent to Lorin Wright, Coldwater, Kansas. Bought Pantaloons at Manhattan's \$5.85, thin vest, \$12.25, celluloid collar .18 cts. Susan & I called at Beddell's to see Mrs. Billheimer, who had called to see us in morning.

Thursday, May 19 Went to Town Sat. for a Negative at Appleton & Hollinger's. Exchange Pantaloons at the Manhattan Clothing Store, 45 cts. less than others. Got a draft from Ellis Wright for \$60.00.

Friday, May 20 Went to East Side of the City in afternoon. Got proof of negatives & attended to various items of business. Dr. L. Davis called in the forenoon.

Saturday, May 21 Went with Mrs. Wright to dentist, and attended to various items of business. Preparing to go to the Pacific Coast. Sent [blank]

Sunday, May 22 Heard A.W. Drury at Summit St. Church at 10:30, Ex. 33:18. Dr. L. Davis called in the evening. Also Rev. M.R. Drury & wife, and Chas. Keller. (Keller later in life stole a ham, was arrested, confessed—he was perhaps somewhat insane).

Monday, May 23 Started on 7:15 train for Colfax, Wash. Territory. Hard to go and leave the family so alone! Call a half hour at Richmond, Ind. at D.K. Zeller's. Went on to Chicago. John Selig & wife (First) aboard from New Castle to Anderson. Rev. Harmon Baptist from Cincinnati. Start on Chi., Mil, & St. Paul at 10:30 for St. Paul.

Tuesday, May 24 Find Rev. S.D. Badger, Baptist of Rantoul, Ill., aboard. Saw Rev.*Thomas of Lacrosse aboard; the Masonic herd. Reach St. Paul at 2:15. Get half-fare ticket at \$33.75 to Palouse Junction. Start at 4:00. Interval, here, between twilight so very short. Pass Sauk Rapids about sunset. *Thomas was badly wound

up by Blanchard at Chicago "Congress."

Wednesday, May 25 Awake at Fargo. Pass Dalrymple on the great wheat farm; Jamestown, Bismarck, and Mandan on the Missouri. Dickinson, Medora in the Bad Lands. Cross the Little Missouri. Pass Mingsville just before dark. Pass Glendive in the night.

Thursday, May 26 Awoke about Forsyth. Reached Livingston at two o'clock. Helena 7:50. A very pleasant day, it was.

Friday, May 27 Awoke on Clark's Fork of the Columbia. Passed Heron about 10:00. Passed Pendd. Oreille Lake. Reached Spokane Falls about 2:00. Got to Palouse Junction about 8:00. Stay at Warren Frank's. Had fair accommodations. A young man was there, who was going to see his affianced, who was very sick, he knew, but who died the 25th.

Saturday, May 28 Arose at 4:30. Bathe and put on fresh "linen" & socks. Go on 7:00 train to Colfax. Reach there at 2:00. Henry Arrasmith meets me and takes me to his house, near Bethel Church. Rev. J.M. Tresenriter along. Supper & lodgings there. On the whole, this is the easiest trip I have ever made to the coast.

Sunday, May 29 Pr. at 11:00 at Bethel, 1 Ki. 18:21. Dine at Jacob Arrasmith's. Pr. at 4:30, 1 Cor. 13:13. Supper & lodging at Henry Arrasmith's. I was right unwell from 2:00 morning till near meeting time. Better in the afternoon. Very hot day. Stay at Henry Arrasmith's.

Monday, May 30 At Henry Arrasmith's. Largely spend the day in reading. Feel a little the worst from yesterday's ailment and labors. Peter Arrasmith's fixing a muslin tent to go to their other ranch. Judge Kincaid brought the teacher, Miss McBride. Stay at H. Arrasmith's.

Tuesday, May 31 In the evening go to Peter Taylor's and stay till bed-time. Had staid at Arrasmith's till 4:00, and I returned there and lodged.

Wednesday, June 1 Spend forenoon in reading Revised New Testament. Read more than half of Matthew's Gospel. Read also in the life of Wm. Bramwell. Supper at John Ar[r]asmith's, 1 mile below the church. Stay at

Judge C.M. Kincaid's, 3 ms from Colfax.

Thursday, June 2 Go up to Henry Ar[r]asmith's. Spend forenoon in reading. Afternoon, Bro. Arrasmith takes me in a hack up the road, & down Clear Creek, & across the Palouse River to Rev. J.S. Rhoads'. Stay there that night. Read considerable in Finney's Lectures on Theology; on Sanctification & Election.

Friday, June 3 Went to Rev. J.A. Kenoyer's. Dined there and spent the afternoon. Went after supper, to Rev. J.S. Rhoads'.

Saturday, June 4 Rev. J.A. Kenoyer takes me to Henry Arrasmith's, and thence through the rain to Bro. Lonsh's, 1 1/2 from Elberton. After dinner to Rev. H.O. Kern's. Staid there till morning. Bro. Kenoyer also staid till morning.

Sunday, June 5 Rev. H.O. Kern took me to Rev. W.R. Lloyd's at Garfield. Went with Him to Cedar Creek, seven miles east of town. Pr. at 11:00, John 1:29. Dinner at John Horton's. Pr. at Garfield at 4:00 to a large congregation, 1 Cor. 1:23, 24. Stay at Rev. W.R. Lloyd's. Rev. S.E. Lloyd there & family: Milton 7, Rolla 4, Ray 3. Garfield is on Silver Creek.

Monday, June 6 Mailed a letter home. Went to Dr. Samuel Simpson's. He is a Baptist & strong anti-secrecy man. I dined there, and went in the afternoon back to Garfield & got a letter from home, dated May 27th. Went on to Bro. Lloyd's new house one mile out of town. Supper & lodging there. Earnest & Hattie are their children.

Tuesday, June 7 Dinner at Rev. J.M. Tressenriter's. Mother Finch and her daughter-in-law, there. Called at Wm. Carter's. They tenting there. R.I. Evans came after me, and I go to his house, five miles south-west of Garfield. Lodge there. Earnest 17, & George (9) are their children. Carter's father-in-law is Cling.

Wednesday, June 8 Stay at Bro. Evans. Write a letter home, and read some. Bro. E. lives on the east bank of the N. Palouse 300 ft above the creek (river). Pine trees, some of them 150 feet high, grow along the bluf[f]s and bottom. Bro. E. once lived near Harrisburg, Or-

gon. He was from blue-grass, in Kentucky. Was a Campbellite. Was at Walla Walla at time of the fanaticism. Rainy evening.

Thursday, June 9 At Evans. He 60, past. Went in afternoon across the bridge, 1/4 mile below, and then up the river through bushes and over loose basaltic rocks & climb the bluffs above. Fine cliffs 200 feet above the river. Rained in the evening and night. Write some. Saw Rev. S.E. Lloyd & wife & children out fishing.

Friday, June 10 Remain at Bro. Evans. Go in the afternoon a mile S.W. to look at some high basaltic bluffs on the river. Write a letter to Rev. John McBride. Stay at Bro. Evan's. His son William and daughter Clara (Mrs. Peter Arrasmith) there, that night.

Saturday, June 11 Bro. Evans goes to Colfax, and I go to Elberton afoot, about 3 1/2 ms. Dinner and lodging at Luther Kerns', a brother of Rev. H.O. Kerns. He a M.E. His wife a U.B. In afternoon, study some on a sermon on Rom. 8:21. Stay at Kern's.

Sunday, June 12 Rainy day; small congregation. Pr. at 11:00, Ps. 16:8. Dine at James Pickard's. Rev. W.R. Lloyd, R.I. Evan's & family & Mr. Erwin there. J.S. Rhoads came. Pr. at 4:00, Rom. 8:21. Few out. Go over to Rev H.O. Kern's & back to town. Stay at Luther Kern's.

Monday, June 13 Go before breakfast to Rev. H.O. Kern's. Their two younger boys have the measles. We start about 8:00 for Huntsville. I got 2 letters (Evans & H.M. Balch) and write 3 cards at Colfax. Rain ceased. Lunched between Union Flatt & the Penawawa. Cross Snake River at Penawawa ferry. Stop on the Deadmen Creek & stay. Lodge in the house. Lunch out-door. Groom's.

Tuesday, June 14 Go on via Pataha and Tucanon Creeks to Huntsville, ariving at 4:00. Home at B.J. Hunt's. He was the proprietor of the town, formerly. Called at Rev. J. Black's. Rev. A.R. Olds' pr. at 8:30. Rom. 8:28. It rained that evening & next day.

Wednesday, June 15 At Hunt's; Seminary, and Rev. W.C. Gallaher's. Rev. C.C. Bell pr. at 8:30, John 14:6; Feebly.

Thursday, June 16 Conference (Walla Walla) opened at 8:30 (9:00) Read Ps. 126. Sung "Zion Stands" & "Nearer my God." Revs. A.R. Olds and A.W. Suepp were received on transfer from Oregon. The latter not present. Afternoon. Entered onto examinations of non-pastors and pastors. Rev. T.J. Cocking pr. at 8:30. Said to be of moderate ability.

Friday, June 17 Conference opened promptly. Reports and examinations. Examinations continued. In afternoon, the proceeding on report on grievance were interrupted by chair ruling it out. Recommended. Pres. W.S. Walker made an address on education at 8:30.

Saturday, June 18 Session continued. J.W. Tresenriter and N. Evans elected P.E.'s. Stationing Committee meets in my room at Father Hunt's at 12:45. Session afternoon. Stationing Com. retired a short time, etc. & report read. In the tabernacle, Rev. J.J. Gallaher pr. 1:45 minutes, Hebrews 12:1. I slept about 4 hours.

Sunday, June 19 Pr. at 11:00, 1 Tim. 4:16. Rubbed up all the ministers somewhat. Dine at Rev. J. Black's. At 8:00 Woman's Association organized. Pr. at 8:30, 1 Cor. 5:7. Communion. Four joined Church. Congregation lingers long; a time of rejoicing.

Monday, June 20 Remained at Father B.J. Hunt's and took a copy of the chart (Conf.) of Bro. J.C. Spoonemore. Pres. W.S. Walker & wife came and spent an hour or two, before noon. Called at Rev. J. Black's, and Rev. W.C. Gallaher's and Wm. Mitchel's. Went on the 7:20 train to Hood River. Slept about 4 hours.

Tuesday, June 21 Arrived at Hood River at 5:45 morn. Emory Eldridge met me and took me to Mrs. Harriet M. Balch's, four miles up the valley. Her children: Frederick, 25; Gertie, 17; Herbert, 13; Edna, her granddaughter, 9. Miss Bela Snyder, there. Jesse, her father lives 6 miles from Lyle, W.J. He and Mrs. Balch are my second cousins. Pr. at Sch. House at 8:30, Heb. 4:14.

Wednesday, June 22 Went at 4:30 to Hood River with Emory Eldredge. Took the train for Portland. It was 2 1/2 hours late. Dined at the Quimby House. Sent Susan (Wilbur) \$29.00; Reuchlin or Lulu \$20.00 present. Went

on to Albany. Staid at Russ House. Salvation singers, street.

Thursday, June 23 In Birmingham, Ala. Cath. L. Wright is born to-day. Our first grand ch. Went on 7:00 train to Corvallis. Hired a livery rig and went on to Philomath with Rev. J.W. Pulley, who had been with me from beyond Portland. Conference began before I arrived. Home at Rev. N.W. Allen's. Rev. J.W. Pulley pr. at 8:30. Jer. 17:12, 13. Supper at Jerry Hinkle's. She Father & Mother Hunt's daugh.

Friday, June 24 Conference continued. Rev. J.H. Watson pr. at 11:00 Heb. 4:9. Dine at Peter Mason's. I pr. at 8:30, Ps. 92:8.

Saturday, June 25 Conf. continued. Much business done to-day. Rev. J.W. Ingle pr. at 11:00, on Revelation. Rev. Wallace Hurlburt pr. at 8:30, Job. 14:14. Conf. Approved minutes & adjourned. I read Stn. Com. Report.

Sunday, June 26 Pr. at College Chapel at 11:00, Gal. 4:45. Coll. of \$41.62 for me. Dine at John L. Aikens with Rev. T.J. Connor. Rev. T.J. Connor pr. at 3:30 Heb. 11:26. Supper at Bro. N.W. Allen's. Missionary meeting at 8:30. Revs. J.G. Mosher and P.C. Hetzler spoke. I raise \$137 +, Mis. Col. & sub.

Monday, June 27 At Board meeting 8 1/2 till 12 & from 1:00 till 4:00. Dine at John Henkle's with T.J. Connor, J.G. Mosher, J.E. Edwards, M.J. Connor, etc. Supper at Rev. M.M. Crow's. Rev. J.H. Watson pr. at 8:30. Stay at Allen's with Watson. Slept 8 hours— first long sleep for a week.

Tuesday, June 28 Watson leaves for home. I stay at Allen's till 4:00 p.m. Some talk. Write a letter. Call at E.C. Wyatt's. Supper & lodging at Jer[r]y M.C. Miller's. His wife from Arbela, Mo. Would like a place in a college. A scientific graduate. Owns property here.

Wednesday, June 29 Spent forenoon at Rev. M.M. Crow's. Malcom living there. Dine there. Spend afternoon at Rev. Ezra C. Wyatt's. Supper there, also. Mrs. Wm. Pearson there. Lodge at N.W. Allen's.

Thursday, June 30 Spend most of the forenoon & afternoon in comparing charts & footing them up. Dine at

Saturday, July 2 Went on 10:00 train to Corvallis. Call at Joshua Mason's. Dine at their boarding-house. See Rev. A.W. Snapp, who is on his way to California, moving by wagon. Prof. G.M. Miller & wife & Prof. Horner come on train to Philomath. Supper & lodging at Rev. N.W. Allen's.

Sunday, July 3 Pr. at 11:00 at the College Chapel, Rom. 8:21. Dine at Rev. Ezra Wyatt's. Pr. at 4:00, John 21:17. Supper & lodgings at John Henkle's. His wife, a daughter of Reuben Gant's. Andrew Gant's son is clerking in Henkle's store. Andrew came to Oregon with our company, in 1857.

Monday, July 4 Called at Allen's. Went to Corvallis on 10:20 train. Mrs. Adie D. Miller delivered the oration. Quite good. Dined at the hotel. Returned on 2:00 tr. Called at Jac. Henkle's to see Jas. E. Connor. Called at Sister Ross', Rev. Jas. R. Parker's. Supper there. Stay at Allen's.

Tuesday, July 5 Called at Jac. Henkle's. Card to Susan. Dine at N.W. Allen's. Write letters for Bellevue and Abique. Supper at Allen's. Call at M.M. Crow's. Attend the temperance meeting at the College doorsteps. Stay at Allen's.

Wednesday, July 6 Call at M.M. Crow's. Call at J.M.C. Miller's. Call at McElroy's to see Lincoln Bennett whose eye was put out by a premature explosion of powder in a bottle. Went out with Prof. G.M. Miller & wife & Jerry's wife and their children on a picnic on Woods Creek. Supper & lodging at Allen's. Prof. G.M. Miller lectured on temperance, College.

Thursday, July 7 Called at McElroy's to see Lincoln Bennett, whose wounds were doing well. Dined at M.M. Crow's. Letter from Susan dated July 1st. Walked most of the way to Wm. W. Starr's. Rode part of the way with

the Gibbs family. Mrs. Marion Parker there— their daughter. Very friendly folks.

Friday, July 8 Rode over to John Buchanan's. Dinner and supper there. She a matron of excellent sense and piety, and is the daughter of Isaac Gardner of Elk Creek, below Drain. Children: Freddie, Alice, Earnest, etc. Bro. Jas. E. Edwards & we go to his house through "16" gates, late.

Saturday, July 9 Stay at J.E. Edwards all day, His large cherry tree has perhaps 20 bushels of Royal Ann cherries. It measures seven feet around, forty-five across, and is about thirty in height. Joseph H. Edwards there. His wife a Gardner. Their child about 8 months old is Earl.

Sunday, July 10 Pr. at Simpson's Chapel at 11:00, Matt. 12:43-45. Dine at Lewis Nelson Price's. Speaking meeting at 3:30 led by Rev. Philip Starr, an able minister of the M.E. Church. I pr. at 4:30 Eph. 2:16. Good congregations. Stay at Joseph Gragg's.

Monday, July 11 Stay at Gragg's till afternoon. Go to Father Olds'. Go on to Guilford Barnard's. Jas. E. Edwards calls in the evening. Stay at Barnard's.

Tuesday, July 12 Go to Jas. E. Edwards' (& Joseph H. Edwards) early in the morning after breakfast, and with him to Corvallis. Dine at boarding house with Edwards. Go on 2:00 train to Philomath. Prof. Condon of the State University is aboard & talks on partial inspiration. Call at Rev. M.M. Crow's. Go to A. Bennett's. Supper & lodging there.

Wednesday, July 13 Stay at Bro. Bennett's till afternoon. Bro. Pulley & Mosher there, also. Went to town & to Bro. Allen's again. Lecture at College Chapel at "8:30" on the Prohibitory Amendment to the State Constitution. Stay at Rev. N.W. Allen's. Rev. William Dickson of Prineville, Crook Co., Oregon, there.

Thursday, July 14 Stay at Allen's till afternoon. Pulley dines with us. Bro. Mosher starts to Umpqua in the morning. Dine at Allen's. Call with J.W. Pulley at G.M. Strobe's. His father afflicted. Call at Underhill's a minute. We with Rev. T. Connor visit Sister Berry's family. Stay at Rev. N.W. Allen's.

Friday, July 15 Went with Rev. J.W. Pulley to Wm. Wyatt's. Stay there till next morning. Eva is their daughter. Frank, their youngest son. An older son is at home. Wrote letters & cards there and before going there. Mrs. Wyatt not at home but in very poor health at her daughter, Springer's.

Saturday, July 16 Came to Rev. N.W. Allen's. Get ready to go to Alsea. Dinner at Bro. Allen's. Go with Rev. T.P. Conner, to Alsea. Passed where Wood, Webster, Hayden, live. Stay at David Hawley's near forks of the Alsea. David Hawley's Children: Henry, Iola, Jessie, & Silvia.

Sunday, July 17 Walked to Brown's School-house. Pr. at 11:00 I Pet. 1:4. Seven arose for prayer. Dine at Chas. Malone's. He from central Georgia. Speaking meeting, at 3:00. Preaching at 3:30. My text Matt. 16:26. Supper at Mr. Hull's. Took up subs. for Conner \$51.50.

Monday, July 18 Go to Hawley's & start at 7:20 for Philomath. Find a tree across a broken bridge. Hindered an hour by the burnt tree. Reached Allen's about 2:20. Dinner there with Bro. Conner's. Call at McElroy's to see Lincoln Bennett, who is improving.

Tuesday, July 19 Go on 10:00 train to Albany. Rev. Bowersox, Ev. Ass'n. P.E., on the train. Also Thomas Small, Cumb. Pres. Minister, whom I knew 29 years ago at Sublimity. Elmer Harritt meets me and takes me to Rev. Jesse Harritt's, across the new bridge & two miles west.

Wednesday, July 20 Spend forenoon in cleaning Coats & vest & writing letters. In the afternoon, Alice Emmet & children came: Eddie (here before) Bertha, Jessie. Byron Webster Harritt's wife & child (Jessie) came in the forenoon. Stay at Harritt's.

Thursday, July 21 Wrote several letters & went to Salem with a Mr. Emmett (brother of J.H.) in a cart. Walked home. Afternoon, Squire Johnson & wife came on a visit to Harritt's. They live in Salem.

Friday, July 22 Went to Jas. H. Emmett's. Children Eddie (Edward) 16, Arthur 11, Bertha 8, Jessie 6. Harritt & wife along. Dine there. Also supper there. Go back and stay at Harritt's. See his peculiar fir tree in the field west of old barn. One natural limb. The rest hanging clus-

ters. A most dense shade. A regular ball.

Saturday, July 23 Went on stage at 7:00 via [blank], Zena, & Bethel, to McCoy. Wait there till 3:10 & go on train to Amity. Go with Reuben Gant to H.J. Sargeant's, 2 m's from Bellevue. Stay there. She a daughter of Gants. Dined at hotel at McCoy.

Sunday, July 24 Pr. at Bellevue U.B. Church at 11:00, Heb. 7:26. Dine at Jefferson Davis', a Disciple. Pr. at 3:30, Jer. 13:21. Rev. Hunsaker of McMinnville pr. at 4:30. Stay at Sargeant's. *Remarks:* Went to Church with Reuben Gant. He not a professor, but friendly to the Church. He came to Oregon in 1845. His brother Andrew Gant went to Oregon with me in 1859, via Panama.

Monday, July 25 Went to Rev. C.C. Zumwalt's 1 1/2 miles south of Perrydale. Mr. R. Gant spends the day in hunting grouse. Killed two. *Remarks:* Bro. Zumwalt and wife (then unmarried) came to Oregon in 1845. She a sister of Gant's wife who is deceased. Zumwalt is a Qr. Conf. U.B. preacher.

Tuesday, July 26 Mr. Gant killed another Grouse & left for home. Many pass going to Dallas to preliminary trial of Abe. Blackburn, accused of being leader of the mob who hung Oscar Kelty for the murder of his wife. He is acquitted before Justice Frink. I stay at Zumwalt's, Sheriff Groves, Harry Depew, guard.

Wednesday, July 27 Bro. Zumwalt takes me to Amity (where I found no letter) and to Breidwell's where I took the cars to West Dayton a mile north of Dayton. I walked to Rev. J.W. Ingle's in Dayton. Dine there at 2:00. Go through his ware-house. Stay at Ingle's. She a daughter of Bether's. Children: Ida, etc.

Thursday, July 28 Stay at Bro. Ingle's all day. They do my washing for me. I preach at Baptist Church at 8:00 p.m. Heb. 11:26. Stay at Ingle's. Their children: Ida 16, Effa 14, Hattie 12, Fred 10, Nora 7, Calvin 2.

Friday, July 29 Stay at Ingle's till after dinner. Go on train (narrow gauge) via Dundee, Ray's landing, St. Paul, etc., to Silverton. Get a letter from home, dated 18th. Bro. W.G. Minear meets me & takes me to his house 5 miles north.

Saturday, July 30 Went with Rev. J.S. Osborn to Father Corby's. Grant Corby & his wife live with the old folks. I stay there till next morning. Read in H.B. Stowe's book on remarkable events. About Mill[er]ite excitement, J.Q. Adams fight on right of peti[tion], Explosion of Canon & Sec. Upshur's death, ashipboard.

Sunday, July 31 Went with Bro. Osborne to Abiqua. Called at Wm. Adair's to change clothes. Preach at 11:00, Heb. 11:26, to a house more than full. Dine at DeWitt Hall's. Speaking meeting at 3:20. I pr. at 4:00, Acts 24:25. Call a little at Hall's & at Adair's where I eat supper. Staid at W.G. Minear's, with Rev. J.S. Osborne.

Monday, August 1 Went with Bro. Osborne to Wm. Adair's. Stay there till after dinner. He troubled with eresipelas badly. Was very bad Saturday. Considerably better now. Went to Dewitt C. Hall's. Stay there till morning.

Tuesday, August 2 Call at Wm. R. Adair's. Go to John Whitlock's. Dine there. Supper at Abraham Mosher's at the cross-roads. Call at George W. Hall's. Call again at D.C. Hall's. Stay at Wm. R. Adair's.

Wednesday, August 3 Bro. D.C. Hall takes me via Fillmore (Mt. Angel) to Father Corby's, where we arrive at 2:00. Supper at Chas. Corby's. Pr. at Union Sch. H. at 7:30, Luke 24:46. After lecture on Seventh-day Adventism. Rev. Benham's (adventist) present & the Dodge folks. Stay at Father Corby's.

Thursday, August 4 Grant Corby takes me to Woodburn. Go on 8:53 train to Hubbard. Dine at Mr. Gowdy's 1 m. s. of town. Supper and lodging at Rev. W.H. Palmer's. They have four children; a daughter aged 16, and three sons.

Friday, August 5 Went on 9:00 train to Portland. Got several letters and cards. Bro. B.L. Haines takes me to his house, 9 ms. South. Their children: Albie & wife, Mary 20, Lizzie 17, Willie 16, Luther 14, Ella & Emma 11. Bro. Kenworthy & Wife called in the evening. I staid at Haines'. A fine family,

Saturday, August 6 Bro. Haines takes me to Bro. L.A. Seely's near Wilsonville. Dine there and remain there

till morning. He 67 years old. Their children all married. Seven of them are sons: Geo. B; Joseph Bem; Stephen Bishop; Franklin Flint; Judson Leach; Robert Ira; Edwin R.

Sunday, August 7 Went to Pleasant Hill Sch. H. & pr. 11:00, Rom. 1:16. More than a houseful. Lunch on the ground. Speaking meeting at 2:45. Pr. at 3:30 Acts 24:25. Supper at Geo. B. Seely's & lodging. Saw Father Voss, Mrs. Branat, Mr. Boice, Mrs. Kaufman.

Monday, August 8 George takes me to L.H. Seely's again. Dine there. Stay there till next morning. Much talk. Wrote some letters.

Tuesday, August 9 Go down to Boone's Ferry. Call at Franklin F. Seely's. Miss the steamboat by its coming 20 minutes earlier than usual. Hire mail-carrier to take me to Aurora. Dine at Grocery on canned oysters. Go on 2:00 train to Portland. Get letters & write letters. Leave teeth at C.C. Newcastle's, 167 First Street. Stay at J.B. Lichtenhaler's.

Wednesday, August 10 Went to town. Wrote letters & got letters from Susan. Saw Widdell. Called at Mission room. Saw Rev. G.W. Sickafoose there. Went on the steamboat, Lurline, to Vancouver. Stopped at Ancil Marble's. She lived near Ailey's Chapel, east of Dayton, Ohio. Her father's name was Green. Supper & lodging. Sent postal-order for \$21.49 to Susan.

Whittier on the Puente foot-hills, a fine site. Pr. at New River at 7:00, Acts 26:28. Stay at Alex N. Thompson's, 1/2 mile north. Children: John, Guy, Paul, babe.

Tuesday, October 18 Stay at Thompson's in forenoon. Visit the Ostrich ranches in the afternoon. Twenty-two ostriches; 16 in one, and six in the other. Ranches 1 m. S. of Norwalk. Supper at Thompson's. Pr. at 7:00, at Sch. H., Deut. 18:18. Stay at Luke Charest's, one-third mile south. Children: Mina 13, Clarence 4, Mabel, 3 mo.

Wednesday, October 19 Stay at Charest's all day. Write up sketches. Mrs. Oscar Bloget, an invalid, comes in the afternoon. I preach at 7:00, Ps. 16:11, "At thy righteousness." Stay at Daniel McKeel's. Children: [blank]

Thursday, October 20 Stay at McK's all day. Read in Dugan Clark's "Offices of the Holy Spirit" and found many errors. Good man. Pr. at Sch. House at 7:00, Rom. 1:16. Audience smaller than heretofore. Stay at Alex. M. Thompson's.

Friday, October 21 Stay at Thompson's till after dinner. Go via Charest's to Norwalk & back to Thompson's. Pr. at 7:00, Eph. 5:16, "Redeem time." Stay at L. Charest's. There is a Holiness Church in Southern California—in Arizona & S. California; have about 400 or 500 members. Hardin Wallace & Ash Crafts conceived it. Wallace is their oracle.

Saturday, October 22 Stay at Luke Charest's till afternoon. Go to Norwalk, and thence with Bro. McKeel to his house. Pr. at 7:00, Rom. 8:15,16,17. I scored Quaker doctrine on special revelations, etc. A.M.T. much offended.

Tuesday, October 25 Bro. Wilbur Curtis takes me to Downey. I go to Los Angeles. I call at King's office. Dine at Restaurant. Buy some books at Cor. Second & Main Sts. Go to Rev. T.F. Hallowell's. Stay there.

Wednesday, October 26 I attempt to go to Pasadena with Bro. Hallowell. Just do miss the cars. Go to East Los Angeles. Climb a high hill and look toward Pasadena. Return to Hallowell's and go to Palms with Henry Lowe. Lodge at Lowe's. Attend prayer Meeting at Rev. A.N. King's. Labeer's the Holiness folks.

Sunday, October 30 Pr. at 11:00, John 14:2. Raise \$681.62 and dedicate the Palms Church—the 1st U.B. Church in southern California. Dine at Phineas Tiber's with Rev. M.S. Bovey. Call at Rev. J.W. Baumgardner's two hours before meeting. Rev. M.S. Bovey pr. at 7:00, Ps. 73:24. Stay at J.M. McLaughlin's.

Monday, October 31 Stay at McLaughlin's till after din-

ner. He takes me to Henry Lowe's. Rev. A.N. King's, and Rev. J.W. Baumgardner's. Supper at the latter place. Pr. at 7:00 at Palms, Ps. 16:11. Several asked prayers, as weak in faith. Stayed at Henry Lowe's.

Tuesday, November 1 Rev. W.P. Tibbet comes after me and takes me to his house in Santa Monica. Dine there. Take my first ocean bath in afternoon. Supper at Tibbet's. Go to meeting at Palms. Rev. M.S. Bovey pr. at 7:00, Hab. 3:2. Return with Tibbet to his house.

Wednesday, November 2 After some letter writing, another ocean bath. Letter to Simeon J. Lowe, Joslin, Illinois. Dine at Tibbet's. Ride to Santa Monica Canon & along the beach. Call at Rev. Leheigh's. His Indian adventures. Supper at Tibbet's. Sea Moss. Pr. at Palms, Acts 3:19. Praise meeting follows. Stay at Lewis Stephen's, 3 miles west.

Thursday, November 3 Went to Rev. Jac. Brown's, and thence to Palms & Machado. Take Rev. M.S. Bovey & Elizabeth, his sister, to Jac. Brown's. Stay there till 4:00. Then I go to Rev. A.N. King's. Supper there. Rev. M.S. Bovey pr. at 7:30, again from Hab. 3:2. I stay at Rev. A.N. King's. Child: Abr., Edith, Frank, Fred. Howard, Maimie, Oscar, Walter; David Bryant boards there.

Friday, November 4 Staid at King's all day. Wrote up a number of sketches. Rev. M.S. Bovey called in the afternoon on a pastoral visit. Dinner, supper, and lodging at Bro. King's. I pr. at Palm at 7:30, Ez. 33:11. Belle McLaughlin under deep conviction.

Saturday, November 5 Stay at Bro. King's till 11:00. Dine at Henry Lowe's. Pack my valises somewhat. Call at Bro. Baumgardner's— Bovey's keeping the house. Supper there. Go to Machado. Get a letter & a card. Rev. M.S. Bovey pr. at 7:30, Jas. 5:20. Cyrus Coe & preacher has a little bout over his clicking watch chain. Stay at Rev. Jac. Brown's. Four arose for prayer. Belle one.

Sunday, November 6 Preach at 11:00 at Palms from Phil. 2:9. Began dull, ended animatedly. Dine at Phineas Tibbet's. Call at Baumgardner's & find Bovey alone. Supper there. Pr. at 7:00, Rom. 7:9, 10. Bovey raised 35.00 for me. Stay at Rev. A.N. King's.

Monday, November 7 Go on cars to Los Angeles. Call at Hollowell's. Go on Santa Fee train to Pasadena, Raymond Hotel, Acme Hotel. Talk with Hayes owner of one of the first lots. Walk up the hill—fine door yards. Return to Los Angeles. Buy several books at second hand Bookstore. Go to Rev. T.F. Hollowell's. She gives me a lot of sea mosses.

Tuesday, November 8 Go to Santa Fee depot. Have to wait till 4:00. Dine at the Spencer House Restaurant. Went to A. Wood's South of Temple St. cable-road. Return to Mr. Chapin's office. Go to Depot & start for Riverside. Reach there between 8:00 & 9:00. Rev. H.S. Munger meets me & takes me to his house on Walnut betw 8th & 9th.

Wednesday, November 9 Get letters at the office. Munger takes me out to see new U.B. Church house. Call at Mrs. Martha Hall's. Dine at Bro. Munger's. Ride out to Henry Cole's on East side. Supper & lodging at Bro. Munger's. Their children: Lilly, Bessie 7, Pearly 4.

Thursday November 10 Write in forenoon till 11:00. Go to Hall's. Stay there till meeting. Prayer meeting at 7:00, followed by some calculation on the cost of the church and its indebtedness. Stay at Hall's. Children: Samuel 22; *William 17, Harvey 15; George 9. Two married daughters in Nebraska. *Wm. died.

Friday, November 11 Take Samuel Hall's rig, and with H.S. Munger, go down Magnolia Ave. Dine at Suman's. Call at Able's. See R.R. agent. Call at Church. Go home with Peter Suman. Their only living daughter is Belle, aged about 22.

Saturday, November 12 Stay at Suman's till after dinner. Go to town to the Church. Call at Martha Hall's. See Cole & Bell. Buy articles for going home. Get clothes at China town. Stay at Bro. Munger's.

Sunday, November 13 Preach at the new Church, the first Sermon preached in it, John 21:17, "Thou knowest all things, etc." Dine at Mrs. Hall's. Pr. at 3:00, dedication sermon, Rev. 21:24. Raise \$505.00, & \$50.00 more has been promised. Call at Munger's. Hear Connell lecture at Baptist Church at 7:00 on Temperance. I follow on Moral Aspect. Stay at Rev. H.S. Munger's.

Monday, November 14 Prepare to start home. Have to go on S. Pac. R.R. which starts from Colton at 9:10. So I stay. Dine at Munger's. Go in afternoon to see site of Reubidoux Hotel. Drive down to see Indians huts made of tule. Supper at Munger's & lodging. Attended official meeting at 7:00. Buy Comforter & tin cup.

Tuesday, November 15 Start at 6:55 to Colton. Call on Mother Suman and Mrs. Findlay & on Mrs. Kemp, of Illinois, & Miss Snyder. Buy some articles of food etc. Wait 2:20 hours on train. Start a little before 12:00. Train dines at Indio. Get to Tuxon about 8:00. Sleep five or six hours. Ticket to Dayton cost \$50.50.

Wednesday, November 16 Behind time. Catch a Tarantula at Bowie & find a section of a centipede. Our car set off at last (on acct. hot box). Another halt at Deming on account of a broken rod. Reach El Paso about 6:00. Change cars for New Orleans. Travel all night.

Thursday, November 17 Awaken at Samuels. Breakfast at Langtry. Pass Del Rio, a town of 1,000 inhab. Western way is rolling winding. Cliffs on Rio Grande. Painters Cave. Reach San Antonio at 4:20 P.M. A town of about 35,000 inhabit. Nice country east of the city. Our cars wrecked at Rosenberg Junction abt. 5:00.

Friday, November 18 Arrive at Houston, about 7:00 a.m. Go on through Belmont. Cross Trinity and Sabine Rivers. In Louisiana. Ride in palace car to escape smoke. Tache Biou is a great sugar region. Connect at New Orleans for Cincinnati. Sleep about six hours. Saw Mobile by street lights.

Saturday, November 19 Awake about Evergreen. Pass Greenville. See cane-brake. Walk out on streets of Montgomery, Call at Birmingham. Pass Decatur. Reach Nashville after night. Go on through Boling Green & Louisville, toward Cincinnati. Find frost at Nashville. Slept 2 hours. Saw Dr. J.D. Barbee of Nash. *Chr. Adv.* & Col. Colier of *Nash. American*.

Sunday, November 20 Arrive at Cincinnati at 6:35. Arrive at home at 11:00, Dayton, Ohio. Being less than five days from Colton, Cal. Reuchlin & Lulu & babe came. Also Rev. H. Floyd. Also John A. Gilbert & wife & W.L. Gilbert. Slept ten hours. I had left home on

May 23rd. Was away nearly six months.

Monday, November 21 At home. Feel sleepy and tired. Go over & get my trunk from Depot. Pennsylvania colored man engages to saw two cords of wood for Wilbur. Slept 8 hours.

Tuesday, November 22 At home in forenoon. Rev. Halleck Floyd came in afternoon. I called at Dr. L. Davis in the evening. Slept 8 hours.

Wednesday, November 23 Spent much of the forenoon in clearing up my writing desk. Floyd called in the afternoon. In the evening, wrote an article for the *Conservator*.

Thursday, November 24 Rewrote the article on the "Millennium's Approach." Reuchlin and Lulu took dinner with us and spent the day at our house. Wrote some letters. A rainy day. Alfred Feight called in to see about Southern California.

Saturday, November 26 At home. Spent day mostly in reading and writing and in putting my clothes in order. Dr. Lewis Davis called in and spent an hour. Mrs. Glenn called a half hour in the afternoon. I went about dusk, to look after the new levy.

Sunday, November 27 Attended Summit Street Church at 10:30 about 175 or 200 present. Matthews pr. Ps. 96, 8, 9. At home the rest of the day.

Tuesday, November 29 At home in the forenoon. Went to town in the afternoon. Called at D.L. Rike's residence; at Mission Rooms; did some trading. After supper took proofs to Grabill's. Called at Rev. Wm. Dillon's a few minutes.

Wednesday, November 30 Went to Reuchlin Wright's, Grabill's, Dillon's. Got home at dinner time. Spent the afternoon mostly in brushing and sponging my clothes.

Thursday, December 1 Called at Reuchlin's in the morning. At home all the rest of the day. Called at Reuchlin's in the evening.

Friday, December 2 At home in the forenoon. Went to town in afternoon shopping with Katie.

Sunday, December 4 Attended Qr. meeting at High Street and heard the presiding-elder, Rev. S.W. Keister preach, Ex. 12:26, last clause, a good sermon. Communion service, which I conducted. At home the rest of the day.

Monday, December 5 At home. Called at Reuchlin's in the forenoon a little while. Lulu called in the afternoon.

Wednesday, December 7 At home. Went to town & did some trading in afternoon. Lost my fountain pen.

Friday, December 9 Went to town before noon. Left Katie's breast-pin at Reeve's jewelers. Could learn nothing of my lost fountain-pen. Reuchlin called in the evening. Sat up late reading.

Saturday, December 10 Arose early. Slept an hour in the forenoon. Was to attend a meeting of the Ex. Cam. Mission board. Met the committee at 2:00. Nothing of [repeated in text] very special interest.

Sunday, December 11 Attend church at Summit Street. Rev. G.M. Matthews pr. at 10:30, Eph. 1:6 an able discourse & good so far as sound. At home the rest of the day and in the evening.

Monday, December 12 At home all day. Busy adjusting papers in my desk, etc.

Tuesday, December 13 At home all the day. Adjust the doors of the house all over. Visited Reuchlin's in the evening.

Wednesday, December 14 At home all day. Fix up things some what and write some.

Sunday, December 18 Staid at home with Mrs. Wright while Wilbur went to Church. Did not leave home all day.

Monday, December 19 Went to Richmond on 8:10 train. Go to D.K. Zeller's and stay till morning. Counted up the interest on Mother Koerner's note and paid it off in full. Got Mother Koerner pair of net slippers.

Tuesday, December 20 Went on 10:10 train to Anderson. Met Rev. Wm. Davenport & Ithamar McCarty at

the depot. Called at Fairmount and then walked out to Aunt Lizzie Reeder's, 5 ms. S.E. But a Mr. White took me part of the way on a lumber wagon. Lodge at Aunt's.

Wednesday, December 21 Stay at Aunt's till afternoon. Went over to the farm and look over it, Called at Leir Simon's & Henry Simon's & went by saw-mill to see Ellis Wright's new field. Return to Aunt's & lodge there.

Thursday, December 22 Went to Wm. H.H. Reeder's and staid all day. Aunt Lizzie dined there. I wrote some letters. Stay at William's.

Friday, December 23 Remained at Wm's till after dinner made an even settlement with William and certified it with each of our names. Sold him my hay at \$5.50 per ton, to be paid in fencing before summer. Wm. takes me to Fairmount. Stay at Rev. N.D. Wolfard's.

Saturday, December 24 Gave Wolfard \$5.00, his wife \$1.00. Went on 7:00 train to Jonesborough and Union City, arriving at home about 5:00 p.m. Cars so much crowded all the way. Talked a little with Rev. Mr. Robinson who has recently organized an independent Wesleyan church at Union City.

Sunday, December 25 This is the first Christmas, for several years, that I have been at home. Reuchlin & Luly & baby dine with us. I did not leave home through the day.

Monday, December 26 At home. Mrs. Feight called in the afternoon; Rev. H. Floyd in the evening. Suffered from dental neuralgia at night.

Tuesday, December 27 At Home. I spent much of the day in classifying my papers.

Wednesday, December 28 Col. Robt. Cowden came in forenoon & staid till after dinner.
